



**Keynotes Annual Meeting Here:
Dr. C. A. Ray Urges YMCA Members To Become "Public Relations Conscious"**

Public Relations Conscious
People should relate themselves directly to significant causes such as the YMCA, and then strive successively and creatively to bring others to their points of view, declared Dr. Charles A. Ray of North Carolina College, Durham, at the annual meeting of the Board of Street YMCA, Raleigh, last week. He was introduced by R. H. Toole, secretary, YMCA Board of Management, with C. A. Haywood, chairman, presiding.
A public relations expert, Dr. Ray, urged Association members to become "Public Relations Conscious" to assume responsibility for selling the "Y" program and thereby keep the public informed. The future of civilization depends on people everywhere learning the fine art of cooperation to achieve the objectives of a Christian democracy, he declared.
Six members were re-elected to the Board of Management for three year terms following a nominations committee report by Dr. N. H. Harris. Those re-elected are C. A. Haywood, A. V. F. Carpage, Dr. N. H. Harris, A. E. Brown, C. A. Marriott, J. A. Mann.
The annual report by E. L. Rayford, general secretary showed that during 1957 the "Y" sponsored 19 club groups, 10 regularly scheduled group activities, 9 special events, 72 community clubs and organizations used the "Y" facility for meetings and other activities. The grand total participation amounted to \$3,657.
In a feature "Echoes of 1937," H. E. Brown, principal, J. W. Ligon High School discussed YMCA community services; James W. Wyrche, dormitory services; Eugene Stripes, Gray Clubs and Garland Hunt, U-Y Club services.
Dr. N. H. Harris, chairman of the membership committee presented service awards to 35 members for meritorious services during 1957.
Special music was presented by the J. W. Ligon High School Boys Ensemble and the First Congregational Church Ensemble with Ernest Messenburg, directing.
The invocation was pronounced by the Rev. Robert L. Shirley, pastor of the Davis Street Presbyterian Church and the benediction by the Rev. Howard Cunningham, pastor of the First Congregational Church.
