

11 Per Cent Of Voters Are Negroes

LITTLE ROCK -- (ANP) Approximately 11 percent of the total eligible voters in Arkansas this year are Negroes, according to a report issued last week by the state auditor.

The report, marking the first survey of Negro poll tax holders, shows that out 563,978 eligible vohers, 64.023 are Negroes, It lists a table of eligible voters by county and race, and the number of persons over 31 by county and race. The total of Negro votes is an

approximation, because poll tax numbers of Negroes in 16 counties were estimated. In the other is counties, the figure was taken either from official certification or from lists in county poll books The population figures were obtained from the 1930 census ra-
