## Dr. Nanton In Address At Fayetteville College

FAYETTEVILLE — Dr. H. I. Fontelle Nanton, veteran newspaperman and currently head of the division of journalism at Texas Southern University spoke at a recent assembly period at the Fayetteville State Teachers College from the topic, "Undue Emphasis upon scientific Materialism in Our Colleges."

He was introduced by Dr. Rudolph Jones, president of the Institution. Decrying the current trend in the direction of scientific materialism, the speaker pointed out that our colleges have gone over to technical skills at the expense of the humanities. "A study of the humanities leads to the understanding of one's self and of humanity," he said.
