BALTIMORE, Md. — The promotion of two faculty members and the appointment of one other were announced today by Morgan State College President, Dr. Martin D. Jenkins.

Promoted, effective September 1958, were Dr. G. James Fleming, from associate professor to professor of political science; and Harry L. Johnson, former instructor to assistant professor of English.

To join the Morgan faculty in September as professor of mathematics is Dr. Volodymyr Bohum-Chudyniv, now on the faculty of Morehouse College and Atlanta University, Atlanta, Ga. WISCONSIN PHI BETA KAPPA Dr. Fleming, who joined the Morgan faculty in 1955, is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He holds an A.M. degree in political science from the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Fleming has a distinguished record of research and community service. He served as a researcher on "The Negro in America," a project sponsored by the Carnegie Corporation of New York, which resulted in publication of "The American Dilemma" by Gunnar Myrdal. He was principal editor of "Who's Who in Colored America."

# Levittown Tensions Easing

## Negro Family Settles Down To Quiet Life

LEVITTOWN, Pa. — (ANP) — Tensions brought about by the entrance of a Negro family into this previously all-white community last summer have reportedly eased somewhat since then.

William Myers, 34-year-old air-conditioning technician employed by a Trenton (N. J.) firm, his wife Daisy, 32, and their three children have settled down to normal routine without any publicity.

The feeling in the town is still split. Many opposing the idea of a Negro family in their midst appear to have learned to accept the fact that the Myers are here to stay. Others have toned down their protestations because of a court injunction hanging over them.

One of Myers' white neighbors said Myers wishes to keep to himself and stir up no further trouble. "Overlaid antagonism toward the Myers has completely disappeared," said the neighbor. "The extremists who led the campaign to drive them out have found new channels for their discontent."

## 3 New Workshops Set For Summer School At A & T

GREENSBORO — Three new workshops are being added to the offerings available at the Summer School at A&T College which gets underway on June 2.

The new programs, designed to improve teaching techniques through the construction and use of teaching aids and materials and by demonstrations, include the Audio-Visual Aids, Biological Science and Arts and Crafts, for both elementary and high school teachers.

Calvin R. Stevenson, director of the Summer School, stated that these workshops will be conducted during the six-week period, ending on July 18.

Six other workshops are scheduled for the same period. They include: Adult Education, Language Arts, Nutrition Education, Problems and Trends in

Teaching Science, School Planning and Special Education. Two others of shorter duration are to be offered in Facts about Alcohol (two weeks) and a School Lunch Workshop, for school lunch personnel (three weeks). The workshops are a part of a total of 130 courses being made available to undergraduates seeking additional credit; in-service teachers, interested in renewing certificates of taking courses for professional improvement and graduate students wishing to gain credit towards the master of science degree.
