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**Integration Proceeds  
In Protestant Church**

CHICAGO — Ten per cent of the 280,000 Protestant churches in the U. S. are integrated, and leading churchmen are finding that the teachings of Christianity and racial prejudice cannot exist together, according to an article in the May issue of EBONY Magazine.

Ten years ago, says EBONY, "the Sunday morning church segregated hour in America."

hour was considered "the most A survey of every major denomination and churches in 20 typical cities reveal that this statement, though still true in many areas, is losing its sting.

Churches are integrating in the Bible Belt; in the big cities, and in small mission churches, the EBONY article points out.

With the mobility of whites and Negroes, neighborhoods are undergoing changes, and with these changes many white people continue to go to their church, even though Negroes are admitted to membership.

One technique that is being used by some churches in changing neighborhoods is that of using an interracial ministry.

Although problems remain, says EBONY, the Protestant Church is undertaking to prove the true meaning of Christianity.

**AMBER SALAD MOLD**  
This shimmering Amber Salad Mold featuring diced ham and vegetables captured in apple-flavored gelatin is a perfect choice for a soup and salad luncheon. The medley of crisp celery, cooked peas and diced ham is especially flavorful teamed with apple-flavored gelatin that has been seasoned with salt and vinegar.

It's easy to prepare and can be made after dinner with left-over ham and peas, if you wish.

Serve Amber Salad Mold as an accompaniment for cream of tomato soup and be sure to include plenty of hot buttered rolls. As a side salad with open face grilled cheese sandwiches, it is equally as tasty.

**AMBER SALAD MOLD**  
1 package apple-flavored gelatin  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 cup hot water  
1 cup cold water  
1 tablespoon vinegar  
2-3 cup diced cooked ham  
1/2 cup cooked peas  
1/2 cup diced celery

**METHOD:** Dissolve gelatin and salt in HOT water. Add cold water and vinegar. Chill until slightly

thickened. Fold in ham, peas, and celery. Pour into 8x8x2 inch loaf pan. Chill until firm. Unmold on crisp greens. Garnish with sour cream or mayonnaise topped with additional peas, if desired. Makes 5 servings.

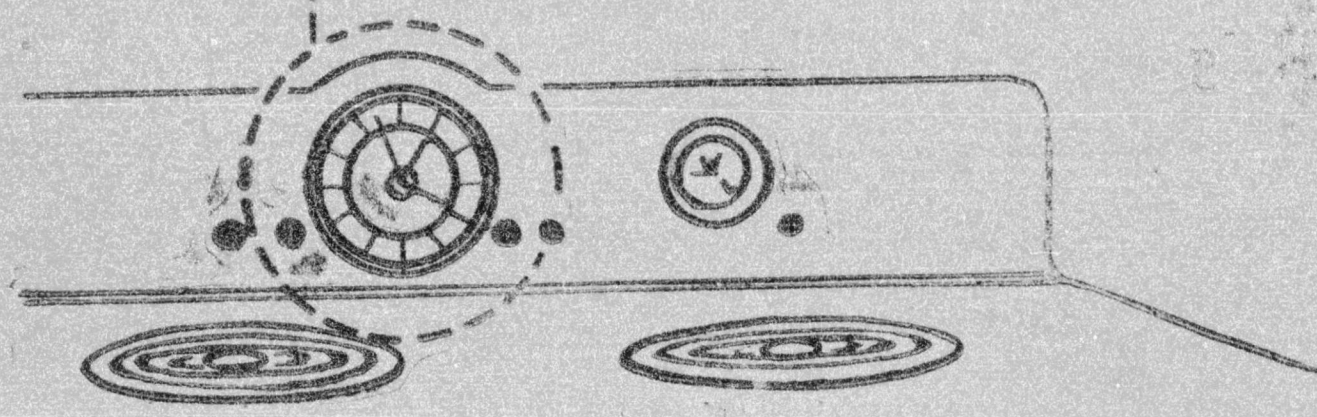


**Know-How With Screws**  
A lot of home repair jobs will be easier if you know the right ways—and steer clear of the wrong ways—to drive a screw. Take the problem screw that has worked loose in its hole and won't stay put. You can deal with this by filling the hole with Plastic Wood and resetting the screw after the filler has hardened over night.

To start a screw in soft wood, make a shallow indentation with an awl or gimlet. Drill a pilot hole when driving a screw into hard wood. This will lessen the chance of splitting the wood, and you won't be so likely to break down the edges of the slot in the screw head.

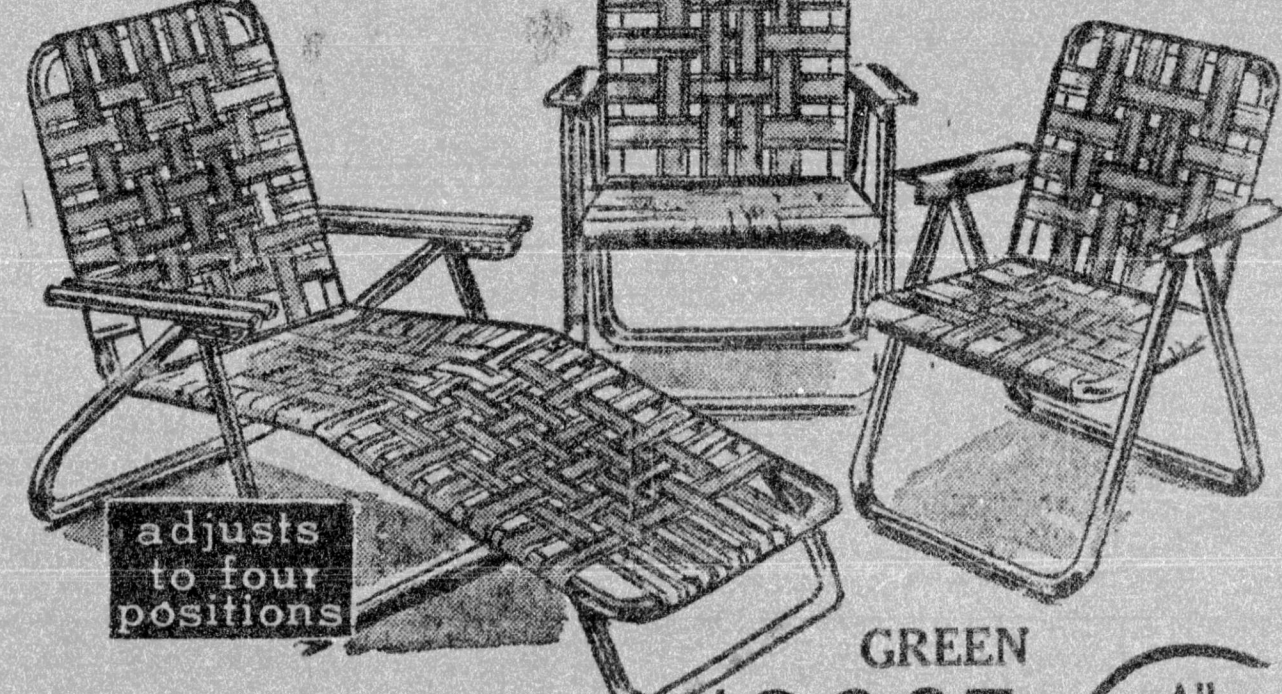
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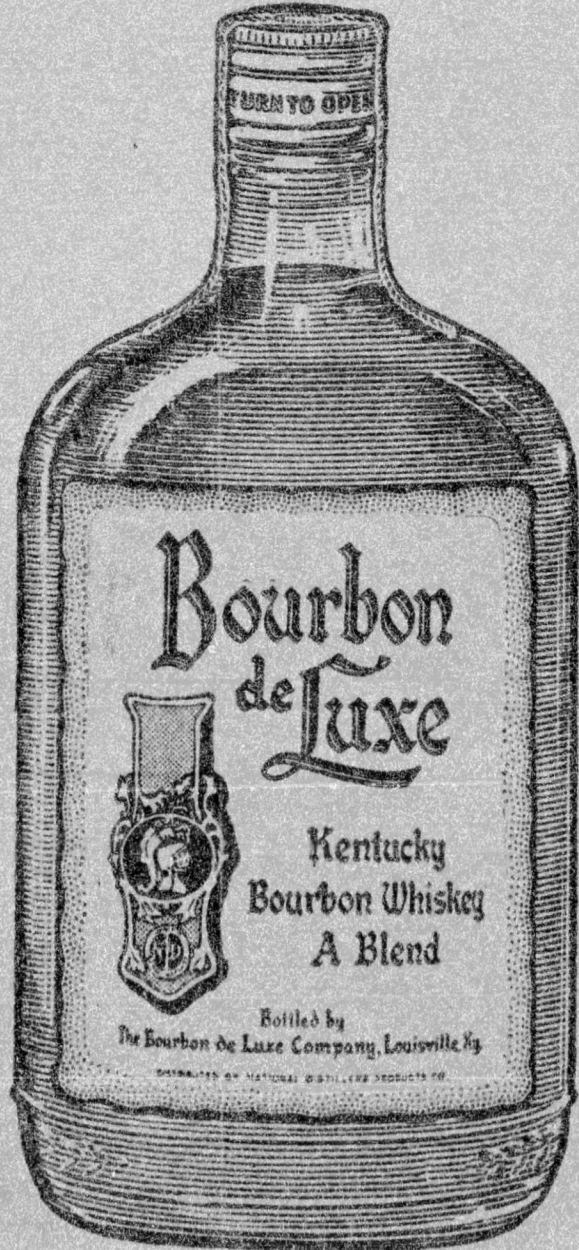


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
