Man Wounds Woman Fatally In Office

CHICAGO — (AP) — A man, brooding over his broken romance, fatally wounded his estranged common-law wife within view of 500 persons in a crowded office building here after chasing her up and down the aisles and between rows of desks.

The victim was Forestine Stewart, 22, who was shot in the state employment service office as clerks and claimants scrambled for cover. She died in Englewood hospital a few hours later.

Held as the possible assailant was Eddie Anderson, 35, who was arrested at Miss Stewart's apartment.

According to reports, Miss Stewart had gone to a desk to file a claim. A few seconds after she spoke to the clerk, she came back saying a man with a gun was threatening her. The clerk called the manager. But as she arrived on the scene, bedlam broke loose among the 40 employees and the crowd of claimants, as the man began chasing Miss Stewart. He caught up with her and shot her a few seconds later.

Miss Stewart told police before she died that a "broken romance" was responsible for the shooting.

Tar Heel Instructor Advises Florida Meet

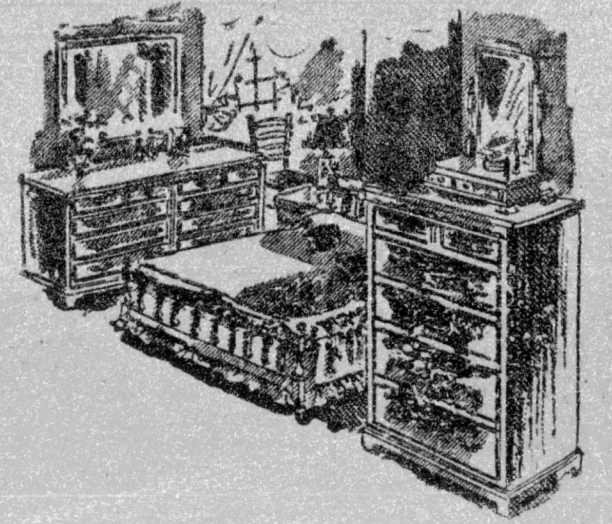
NCC PROFESSOR TO ADVISE
