W. J. Trent, Jr., Dr. A. D. Gray:

Two Nationally Known Figures To Address St. Paul's Senior Class

LAWRENCEVILLE, Va. — Two nationally known men in the field of education will be the commencement and baccalaureate speakers at Saint Paul's College on May 25th and 26th.

They are William J. Trent, Jr., executive director of the United Negro College Fund, and Dr. Arthur D. Gray, president of Talladega (Ala.) College.

Mr. Trent will deliver the commencement address on Monday, May 26th, while Dr. Gray will be

the baccalaureate speaker on the preceding day.

Mr. Trent has served in his executive capacity with the 33-member UNCF since its establishment in 1944 as a co-operative fund-raising agency. Son of the retired president of Livingstone College, Dr. Trent has had a life-long interest in education.

He is a trustee of Livingstone College, a member of the National

el Citizens Committee of the United Community Campaigns, the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and the Holly Knoll Associates.

In addition to his training and experience in education, he has held responsible governmental posts, first as advisor on Negro affairs to PWA Administrator and Secretary of the Interior Harold I. Ickes, 1938-39, and then as race relations officer for the Federal Works Agency, 1939-44.

He joined the United Negro College Fund in February, 1945.

Mr. Trent received the B. A. degree in 1930 from Livingstone

College and the master of business administration degree in 1932 from the University of Pennsylvania.

He studied in 1936-37 toward a doctorate in economics and sociology at Pennsylvania and the University of Chicago. He was the recipient of a General Education Board fellowship to continue graduate work and was a scholarship winner at the University of Pennsylvania while in attendance there.

Mr. Trent is married to the former Miss Viola Scales of Winston-Salem, N. C., and they have three children, Kay, Judy, and Toni.

Dr. Gray, Talladega's president, holds many distinctions also. Listed in Who's Who's in America, he is a graduate of Talladega and of the Chicago Theological Seminary. During 1930 he was the assistant to the president at Talladega. He has pastored churches in Washington, D. C., and Chicago.

Currently he is a member of the executive committee of

the International Council of Congregational Churches, the Alabama Council on Human Relations, the Congregational Board of Foreign Missions, and the Division of Christian Education of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.

Dr. Gray previously served as chairman of the executive committee of the General Council of Congregational-Christian Churches, was a member of the board of Parkway Community House, Chicago, assistant national moderator of the Congregational-Christian Churches of America, president of the board of the Chicago Branch NAACP, and a member of the board of the District

of Columbia Branch NAACP, member of the Illinois Commission on Human Relations, moderator of the Chicago Association of Congregational Churches, and a member of the board of directors and the executive committee of the Congregational Board of Home Missions.

Mrs. Shaw left Kansas City Tuesday and had hoped her baby would be born in La Rochelle, France, her birthplace.

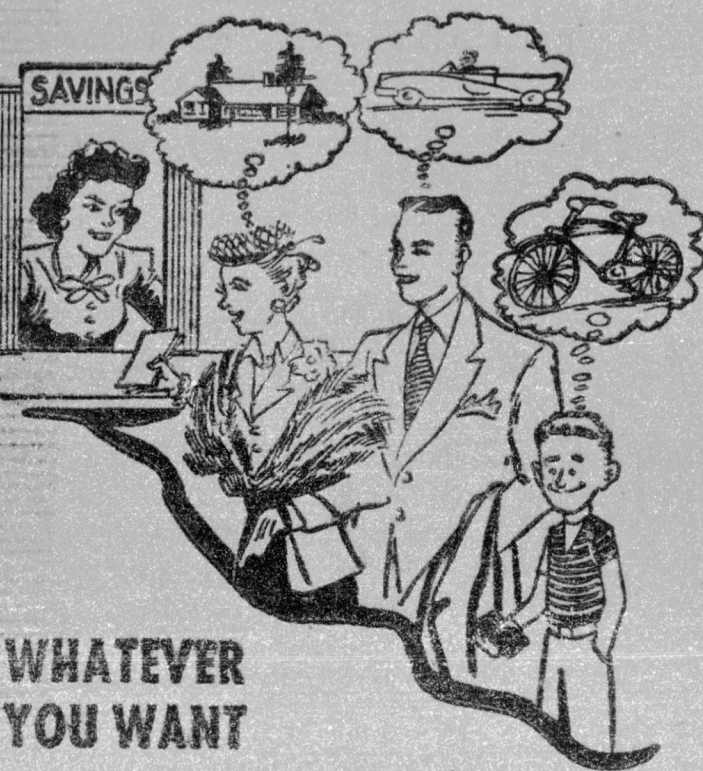
Married to Winn F. Shaw, a Negro service man on duty

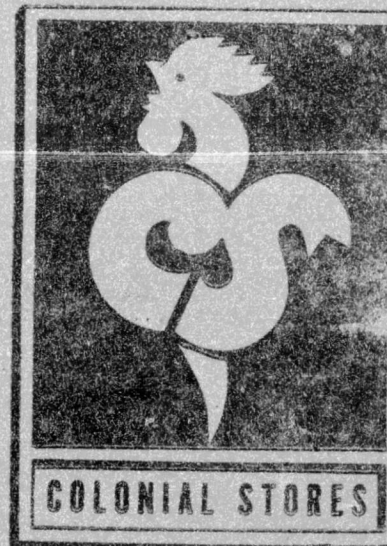
