of the American Teachers Association will meet at Bethune-Cookman college July 13 to 15.

The convention date is two weeks earlier than in previous years.

The historic Bethune-Cookman college will be the appealing and advantageous convention site. President Richard V. Moore and his Associates have already begun their local preparations. There will be a special tribute paid to the late Mary McLeod Bethune, who was the first lady-president of the new ATA.

The current year ATA annual membership figures have passed the 18,000 mark and should reach the new goal of 22,500 by convention time, according to reports. At least 300 are expected at the convention.

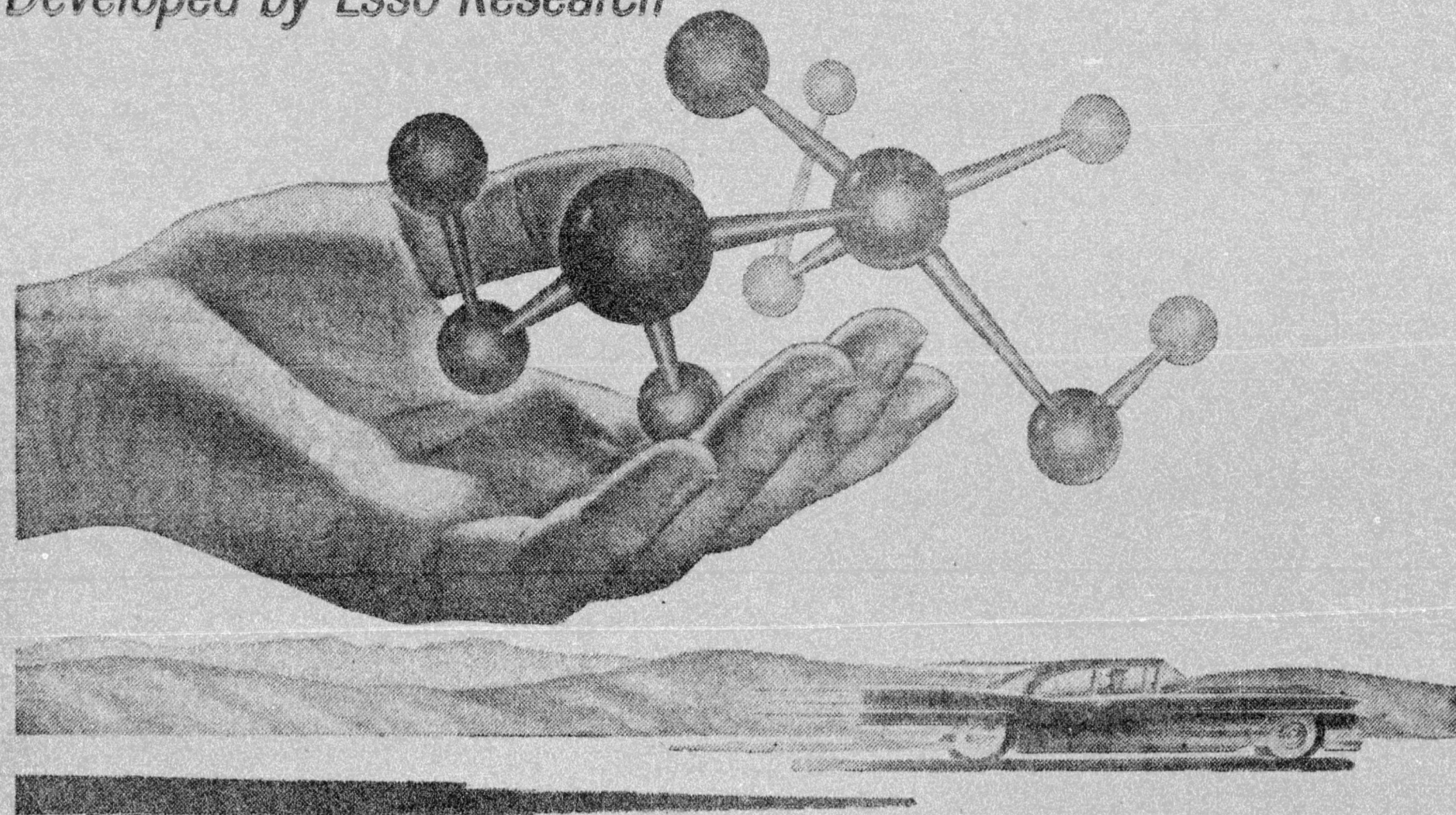
The Little Sisters have now joined their brothers in an effort to beautify a chosen plot on the campus. Congratulations to a job well done.

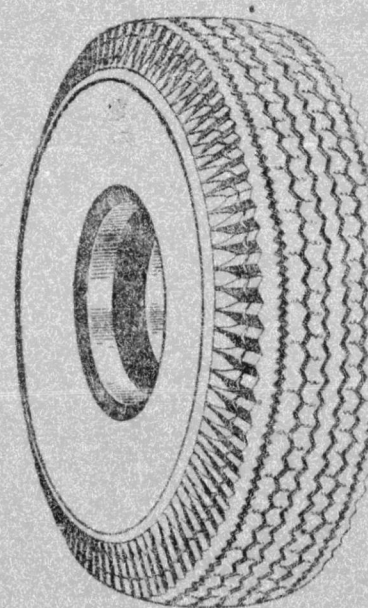
