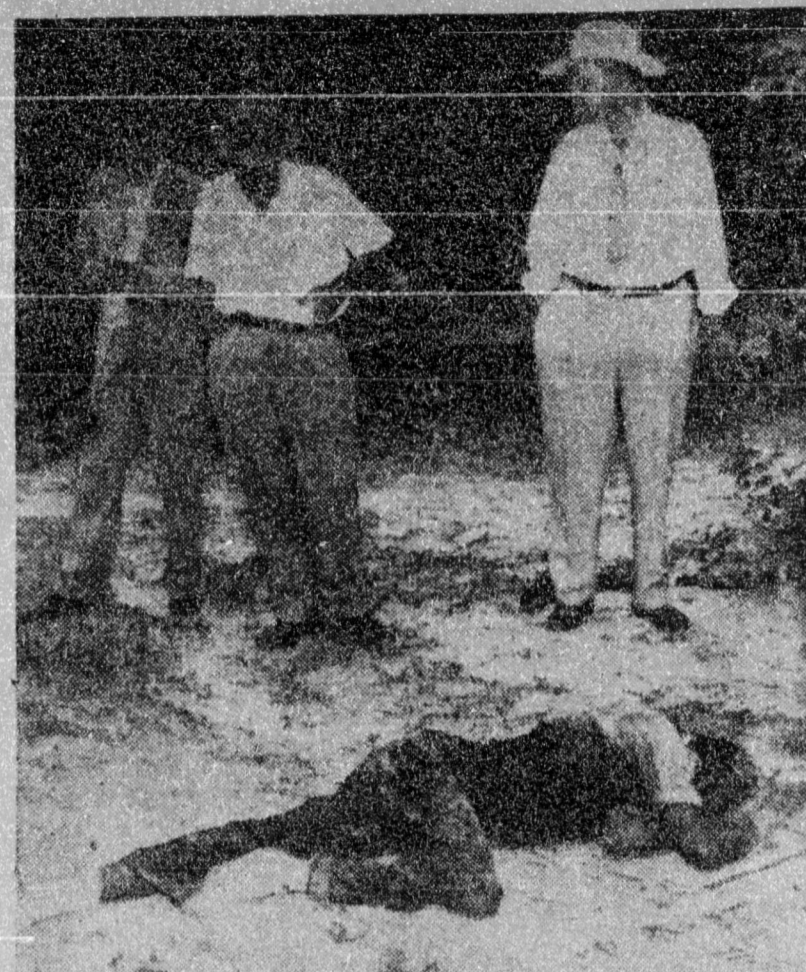

Body Of Janitor Found; Officials Rule Suicide

SPRING LAKE — The bloody body of John Bronson was recently found in a wooded area about 100 yards outside the Spring Lake city limits. Bronson was janitor for the Spring Lake Elementary School. On the morning of the 20th he left home as usual at 5 a. m. to open the school. He did not, however, return home for breakfast as he had always done.
 Bronson the father of 7 children, was found shot once in the chest at close range with a .12 gauge shotgun. Spots of blood were found on the ground in different places and scuff marks were apparent as
