New Homemakers To Hold Nat'l Convention In NC

GREENSBORO — Nearly 600 school girls, members of the New Homemakers of America, are expected to attend the annual National meeting of the organization to be held here at A&T College, June 4-13.

Delegates from 15-states, representing 57,000-odd members of the NHA, will participate in general sessions and group discussions that will focus attention on the value of an education, career opportunities in home economics, becoming better citizens, improving their human relations and broadening spiritual values.

Among the prominent educators scheduled to work with the group are: Dr. Warrick T. Gibbs, president of A&T College who will address the opening general session on Monday night; Dr. S. Duncan, Raleigh State supervisor of Negro High Schools; recently elected president of Livingstone College, Salisbury and Mrs. Clara Evans, chairman of the Home Economics Department at A&T.

Dr. Irwin Sperry, professor of Family Development at Woman's College of the University of North Carolina, will speak at the Tuesday session on ways of improving human relations in his talk, "You and Others". The NHA delegates will have opportunity to express their views on "As Others See Us", in group discussion work immediately following.

A & T College Students Get High Posts

GREENSBORO — A female student who saw military service and a football star were elected to high student posts at A&T College last week.

Miss Felicia Black, Greensboro, an attractive rising senior who served two-years in military service with the Women's Army Corps and Edward Nesbitt, Georgetown S. C., one of the leading ground gainers at the fullback post last season with the A&T College Aggies swept to easy wins as "Miss A&T" and president of the Student Council, respectively, in spirited elections conducted on last Wednesday.

Miss Black, an honor student in Biological Science with an average of better than 3.00, won out over Miss Estevoline Smith, Nolina, N. C. and Miss Laverne Massenburg, Waverly, Va. She holds membership in the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and a host of student professional and social organizations.

Nesbitt, also an honor student, majors in Physical Education, is a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and is a nominee for "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities". He defeated two other candidates, Norman McDaniel of Fayetteville, N. C., and Raymond Crump of Danville, Va. The two-winners will be formally installed at the opening of the fall term.

Tan Medics On Staffs Of 9 'Chi' Hospitals

CHICAGO (AP) — A survey of Chicago's 83 hospitals disclosed that only nine of them have Negro physicians on their staffs. The survey was made by the Commission on Human Relations. It said that all Negro doctors holding appointments at predominantly white hospitals are specialists, and that was how they obtained appointments.

Seven percent of the local Negro physicians had hospital staff positions. One third of them were appointed within the last two years. Here again, professional relationship with prominent white doctors was the key to their appointment.

"Not True, Dinah Shore Is Anti-Negro," Says Representative; Mahalia Jackson To Appear

HOLLYWOOD — (AP) — A charge that actress-singer Dinah Shore is anti-Negro was branded as "untrue" last week by Charles A. Pomerantz, who is Miss Shore's publicity representative.

In a letter written to Atty. Chester K. Gillespie of Cleveland, O., Pomerantz expressed "surprise, dismay and chagrin" about a charge the attorney made that "Dinah Shore has never had a Negro performer on her program and her show is the only one which fails to present Negro talent."

"I cannot believe that a man in your profession would present false information, compounded by a conclusion wrongly drawn, and then disseminate these base lies as wide-

ly as your letter indicated," he wrote. "Miss Shore is not anti-Negro. It is a lie to say that she has never had a Negro performer on her program."

He said that Miss Shore has had Count Basie and Joe Williams on her programs, and also Nat "King" Cole; that her June 1 show will have Miss Mahalia Jackson as guest star. He also said that Miss Shore has sought, in the past, to obtain Harry Belafonte, Lena Horne and Ella Fitzgerald, but that these artists' schedule had not as yet permitted them to appear.

Explaining why there isn't wholesale usage of Negro talent,

he wrote: "Miss Shore's program is a special kind of musical TV show. She has only appeared in some 20 programs this year. The guest list is small, but outstanding—generally two or three top stars per program, each given as proper a showcase as possible." The Dinah Shore show is aired Sunday nights, over NBC-TV, and

is sponsored by the Chevrolet division of General Motors corporation.
