

# 1,000 Delegates To Attend Seventh-Day Adventist Meet

CLEVELAND (ANP)—More than 1,000 delegates from 20 countries are expected to attend the 48th world conference of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church, June 19-28.

The conference, to be held in the Public Auditorium, will deal with such issues as religious freedom, separation of church and state, Sunday laws, war and peace, temperance, and the church's role in the new age of science. Actions taken will shape the missions, medical and educational program of the denomination for the next four years. Theme of the conference is "The Kingdom Come."

**TO FEATURE ELECTION OF OFFICERS**  
A major highlight will be the election of officers and departmental leaders to new four year terms to serve the world headquarters staff, the general conference, in Washington, D. C. and 10 overseas division head-

quarters. Membership in the world body numbers 1,061,452. There are 12,081 churches, 5,596 ordained ministers, and 40,734 full-time salaried workers.

The present officers are Reuben R. Figuhr, president;

Louis K. Dickson, vice president; Walter R. Beach, secretary, and C. L. Torrey, treasurer.

Both the governor of Ohio and mayor of Cleveland are scheduled to address the conference.

## Grant Of \$7,150 Given To St. Augustine's By N. F. S.

Saint Augustine's College has received a grant of \$7,150.00 from the National Science Foundation to conduct an Inservice Institute for Secondary Mathematics teachers. The course will begin in September and continue through the year. The purpose of the institute is to improve the mathematics instruction on the secondary level. Persons taking the course will receive 4 hours of undergraduate credit.

Classes will be held on Saturdays in the Penick Hall of Science. Persons interested should contact Dr. Prezell Robinson, Dean of St. Augustine's.

R. E. Matthews will be in charge of the institute. North Carolina farmers are expected to increase acreage of corn, soybeans and grain sorghums this year.

## Virginia State To Administer Teacher Exams

PETERSBURG, Va. — Virginia State College has been designated to administer the National Teacher Examination on Saturday, July 19, according to an announcement by Dr. P. C. Johnson, director of VSC's Testing Bureau.

## Little Rock Troops' Salary Challenged; Precedent Claimed

BILOXI, Miss. (ANP)—Saving use of troops at Little Rock set a precedent which a future president might misuse, Sen. John C. Stennis (D-Miss.) wrote to the U. S. comptroller general asking him to look into the legality of payments made to Arkansas National Guardsmen on federal service at Little Rock during the school integration crisis.

In an analytical review before the Mississippi state bar association, last week, Stennis said, "a future president, with less lofty regard for his post, under political pressures, can well take refuge in this precedent, in an attempt to rule with arbitrary power, and make possible our degradation to a nation whose chief executive can quickly reach for military power before civil remedies have ever been tried."

Stennis pointed out that the

comptroller general is "a legislative officer—not an executive officer—the implication being that the comptroller is safe from any undue influence by the President. The comptroller, he said, is the watchdog of the use of government funds, and is required to follow the letter as well as the spirit of the law."

## Marian Anderson Receives Degree At NY University

NEW YORK (ANP)—Marian Anderson received a doctor of music degree during New York university's 126th commencement exercises last week. More than 15,000 persons attended the event held at the University Heights campus in the Bronx.

James B. Conant, President emeritus of Harvard university delivered the principal address, and Vice Pres. See Harold O Voorhis presented the honorary degree citations to Miss Anderson and seven other public figures.
