Dr. Paul Woodring Of UNC In Closing Week Address

Dr. Paul Woodring, instructor at the University of N. C. Chapel Hill, is an experienced educator, trained in Psychology and Education, a teacher of teachers and a consultant in education with the Ford Foundation.

TOO MUCH INDIVIDUAL GROUPING Dr. Woodring criticized too much individual grouping in the elementary, junior and high schools. Each group plans by itself. The groups do not communicate adequately.

WHAT IS LIBERAL EDUCATION Dr. Woodring urged authorities in education to make it possible for instructors to teach what they are best suited to do. Efforts should be made to improve the quality of education this should be the major emphasis.

THE BIG QUESTION The Big Question is not "Who Made The Error? Don't worry about that. The Big Question is "How Can We Correct The Error?"

Boys' State Convention Ends Sessions At Raleigh

A five-day institute designed to teach good government and citizenship was conducted here by the Tar Heel Boys' State Division Six, under the auspices of the American Legion. The institute, June 15th to 21st, was directed by Dr. M. H. Harrington, Boys' State Director, and Mr. J. T. Ormond, chairman, Boys' State Committee.

THE PROGRAM consisted of lectures and addresses by outstanding personalities. June 16th — Welcome address, Dr. W. R. Strasser, president of Shaw University; June 17th — Political Science lecture, J. T. Ormond; June 18th — lecture, Wallace W. Hyde, chief, Records and Driver Improvement Section, Highway Safety Division; June 19th — address, Dr. S. E. Duncan, president, Livingstone College; June 20th — lecture, J. F. Lytle, physical education director, Shaw University.

STRUCTIVE LEADERSHIP to discuss ways and means of complying peacefully with the court's rulings. Information, resources and advice of the appropriate Government agencies should be made available to all officials and community groups seeking to work out a program of education and action.

Church Bonus Money Rules

All purchase slips or receipts presented to your church must come from stores advertising in the CAROLINIAN. Each week carries a date in the Bonus Money period. Purchases eligible must come from the store during the week the "ad" appears. No purchase slips representing a business should be submitted. All receipts must come from individual purchases. All churches in Raleigh and Wake County are eligible. All purchase slips must bear the name of the store from which the purchase was made. All purchase slips should be submitted in the name of the church; and should be in the office of the CAROLINIAN the Monday following close of Bonus period. In order that smaller churches may have an equal opportunity to share in the Bonus Money the following regulation is expedient: No church of over 200 members will be awarded 1st Bonus Money consecutively. It should a church of 200 or more members receive 1st Bonus Money after the first period it would have to wait until the third Bonus period to be presented 1st award again, except where a church has 200 or less members, then it could win top Bonus awards consecutively. However, this does not mean that second and third awards cannot be sought consecutively. Consequently every church group has the opportunity to secure an award every period. No purchase of over \$500 from any one merchant during a week can be credited. There is a ceiling of \$35 per person a week for grocery purchases. In the event of the same amount of purchases by more than one entry, the award will be divided. Weekly purchase totals should be shown on each packet and total placed on the outside of the envelope carrying the period's entry along with name and address. Bonus money winners will be announced in the issue following the closing of each period. All entries remain the property of THE CAROLINIAN. All listings in Blue when the names of the Bonus Money winners are announced in THE CAROLINIAN, and no responsibility is accepted by this newspaper beyond that point.
