The couple plan to make Hampton, Virginia their home.



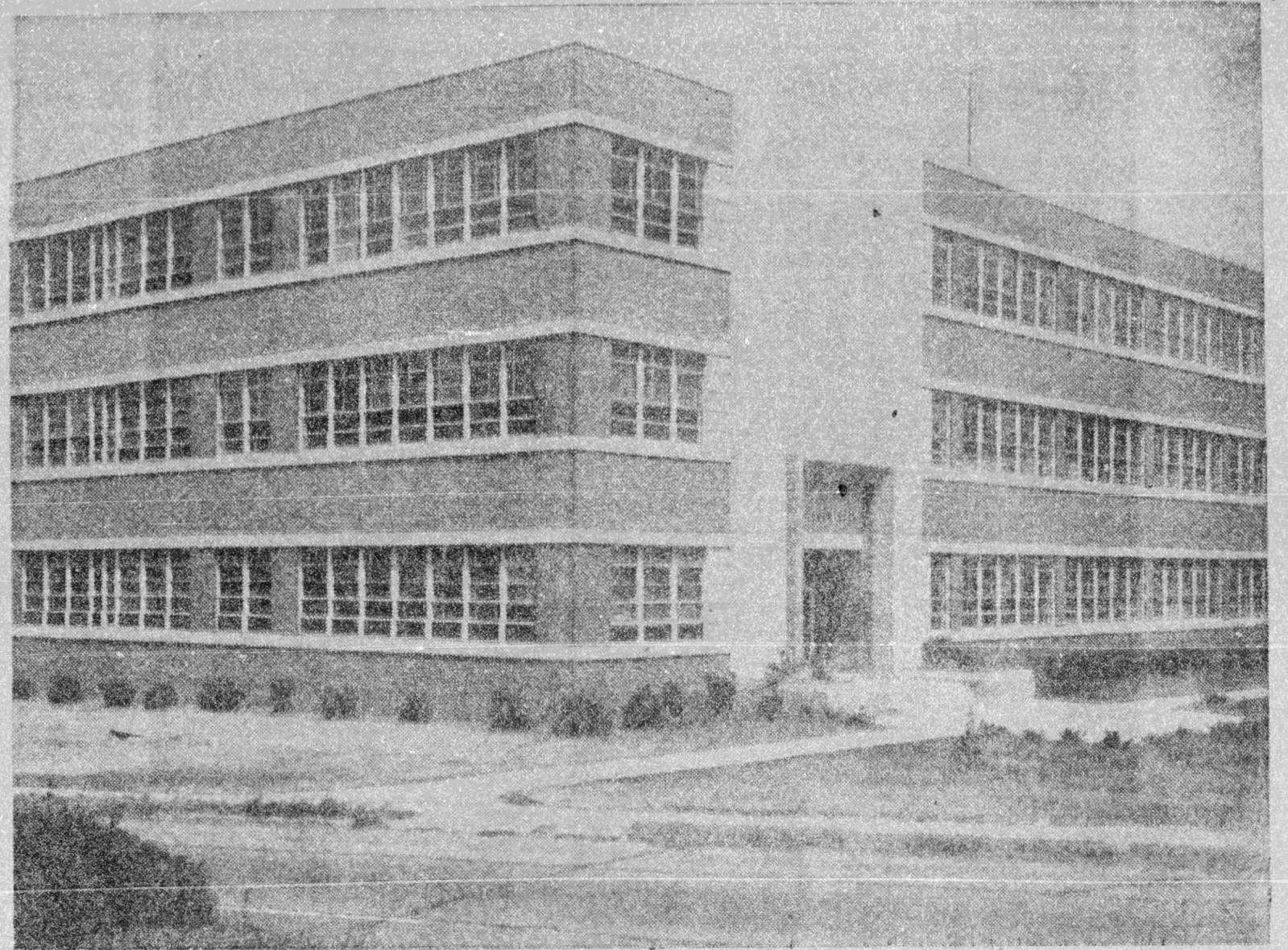
