

National Dairy Council Reports On Its Products

CHICAGO—In 1957, if your eating habits were average for the United States, you consumed milk and other dairy products which uulized 695 pounds of milk produced on the farm, says the National Dairy Council

Divided into individual dairy foods, your purchases last year were as follows: 281 qts, of fluid milk and cream; 8.5 lbs of butter 7.8 lbs. of cheese; 15.1 lbs. of evaporated and condensed milk; 5.7 lbs, of nonfat dry milk; 19.8 qts, of ice cream and other frozen dairy products; 5.2 lbs, of cottage cheese 5.4 qts, of fluid nonfat milk; 16.4 gts. of buttermilk; and 4.1 gts. of hocolate milk.

For the above-listed foods, you spent about 20 cents of each food dollar-or 20 per cent of your food budget. But for this investment, you received many essential nutrients in excess of that percentage. For example, dairy foods contributed to the national food supply 26 per cent of the available protein, 23.5 per cent of the fat, 77.6 per cent of calcium and almost 48 per cent of the riboflavin. Weight watchers will be interested to know that all dairy foods combined contributed only 16.7 per cent of the calories offered by America's food.

How much milk was produced by lairy farmers in 1957. The answer -contained in the dairy organiention's just-published 1958 edition of "How Americans Use Their Dairy Foods"—is 126.3 billion pounds. This all time record production was accomplished with only 20.5 million cows, a smaller herd than the United States has had at any time in the last 40 years. The increased total production is due to greater milk yield per cow-3 per cent increase over 1956 to average 6.162 pounds per dairy

This is a reflection of a longterm trend in which dairy farmer through improved breeding and feeding practices, have increased the efficiency of each cow. Had the 1957 herd produced only at the 1925 rate per cow, 50 per cen more cows would have been needed to meet the production record
