GREENSBORO — More than 600 farm boys and girls from throughout North Carolina attended the 24th annual 4-H Club Week observance held here at A. and T. College last week.

The five-day event featured three major addresses, finals in a state championships, instruction series of contests to determine classes dealing with safety, better personal grooming, everyday courtesies and music appreciation and a merryround of social activities, all of which kept the delegates busy during the entire period.

Principal addresses were delivered by Dr. Warrmoth T. Gibbs, president of A. and T. College; L. E. Hurrell, Raleigh, State 4-H Club leader and Dr. Rosa Butler Brown, chairman, Department of Education, North Carolina College at Durham.

A Halifax County girl was crowned queen of the "Clothing Stars of 1958," a fashion show in which the girls modeled the garments they had constructed. Mil-

red Faulcon, Effield, won the title with a school dress she had made from material won last year as runner-up in the same contest.
