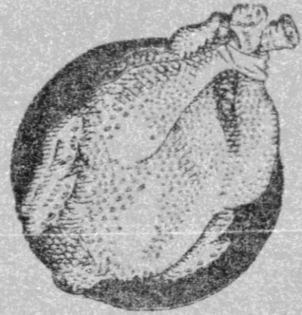

## SCAD Adopts Rulings To Aid Aged In Employment

NEW YORK (AP) — SCAD—the State Commission Against Discrimination—passed new rulings under which it will administer the age provisions of the law. The rulings, which became effective July 1, are:

1. Help wanted ads may not specify age or read "youths" man or woman. This is to enable applicants to appear and be interviewed without automatically being barred by the advertisement.
  2. Pre-employment inquiries as to age or date of birth on application forms will be permitted when required to check an applicant's personal history, background or work record. However, the application form must state that the law prohibits discrimination because of age.
  3. Employers may give consideration to age when it is a "bona fide occupational qualification" where age is a factor in job performance in apprenticeship or on the job training system or where required by statutes such as those regulating child labor.
  4. Application forms used by employment agencies must also note that the law prohibits discrimination because of age.
  5. An employer may not terminate employment of older persons simply because he believes persons over a certain age are physically disqualified.
  6. Retirement policies or systems with compulsory retirement ages below 65 established after July 1, 1958 will be required to justify their reasonableness.
- Commissioner Charles Abrams, chairman of SCAD, announced the adopted rulings after a series of public hearings conducted by the organization.

## Postal Employee Takes Bus Bias To High Court

MEMPHIS — (AP) — O. Z. Evers, 32-year-old postal employee given short shrift in U. S. District court recently when he sued attacking the state segregation laws announced last week, thru his attorney, that he will appeal the case to the U. S. Supreme Court.

Evers has 30 days in which to file the appeal in the case which originated in April, 1956. That was when Evers boarded a bus, sat on a front seat and refused to move to the rear when ordered by the driver. Police, called to the scene, gave him the alternative of leaving or moving to the rear. He left the bus.

In his suit, Evers challenged the state law requiring separation of Negroes and whites on public transportation. The three-judge panel threw out the case on the that Evers was not a regular rider and had boarded the bus merely to institute a suit.

The ruling held "only those to whom a statute applies and who are adversely affected by it may draw in question its constitutional validity in a declaratory judgment proceeding."

The old John Brown Farm home later called Samples Manor, is now being developed in a recreation center for outdoors-lovers who desire a quiet retreat far from the hustle and bustle of city life. A

large hall has been constructed which will accommodate several hundred persons for any type service or amusement. The Old John Brown Homestead (where Brown hid his men for weeks prior to the capture of the U. S. Arsenal here)

has been turned into a museum since a new modern home has been built for Maynard Henderson, the caretaker.
