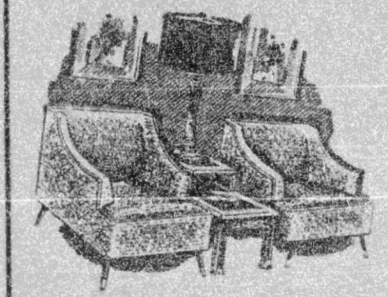

State To Hold First Hearing On Discrimination In Housing

NEWARK (ANP) — The first public hearing on a charge of discrimination in housing, called by the State Division Against Discrimination, will be held at the office of the state department of education July 15.
The respondent is Ceiree Eddy, a housing developer in the Bridgeton Pike Mantua township, Gloucester county, N. J.
Frank G. Moore, Jr., of Philadelphia, the complainant, alleges that he sought to purchase a home in the development, and after a series of delays was ultimately told that he could not purchase a home in the development because he is a Negro.
The housing arrangement in the Newark area against discrimination, signed into law last year, provides that the right to rent or purchase a home may not be denied on the basis of race, creed, color, or national origin.
The statutes provide for the calling of a public hearing upon failure to effect an adjustment of a complaint through methods of conciliation and conciliation.
