Baha'is Of Raleigh, Other Areas Commemorate Martyrdom Of Bab

On Wednesday, July 9, the Baha'is of Raleigh joined with millions of others in 254 countries and territories to commemorate the martyrdom of the Bab, Prophet-Herald of his Faith.

The Bab, a young man of 30 according to Miss Louise Jackson, secretary of the Raleigh

Baha'is Local Assembly, was executed in 1850 by a firing squad in the barracks square of Tebriz, Iran. For six years the Bab had been proclaiming the imminence of a new era which the world would become as one country and mankind its citizens.

Furthermore, the Bab said, there would shortly appear one who would reveal the principles and set up the administrative order that would identify this new era as the one promised to all ages in which God, Himself, would rule His people, and His will would be done as it is in heaven.

The enthusiasm with which thousands, high and low, accepted the Bab's teachings, Miss Jackson

went on to say, alarmed the rulers of "church" and state. They conspired to wipe out this movement and in the persecution that followed, the Bab and 20,000 of his disciples perished. Three years later, the one foretold by the Bab appeared in the person of Baha'ullah, Prophet-Founder of the Baha' Faith.

Today, the martyrdom of the Bab is observed yearly as Baha'is' holy day. On the slopes of Mt. Carmel, Esfah, an shrine which was completed in 1954 in which the Bab's remains are interred. Each year thousands visit this shrine with its golden dome, marble walls and sacred relics located in the midst of terraced gardens which make it one of the beauty spots of the Holy Land.
