Officers said a wild bullet hit Wallace as he stood outside the building. The would-be robber fled. In Wayne County, Coroner I. T. Seymour said no inquest would be held pending an autopsy to remove the bullet. A ballistics test would determine which gun fired the shot that killed Wallace. Although the blind man has denied vehemently that he killed McGirt he is being held under a \$3,000 bond awaiting a Coroner's inquest set for the first week in August. The exact date of the inquest was not announced.

Virginia State College Staffer Dies Suddenly

PETERSBURG, Va. — Mrs. Kathryn B. Flood, secretary to the Library Director at Virginia State College, died suddenly Monday afternoon, July 14. Mrs. Flood was talking to some of her co-workers in the library when she was stricken. She was pronounced dead on arrival at the Memorial Hospital on the College campus. A native of Danville, Virginia, Mrs. Flood entered service at the College in 1954 as a secretary in the Counseling Service. In July of the same year she was transferred to the position she held at the time of her death. She attended the local schools of Danville and North Carolina State College at Durham, North Carolina. Stroud of Danville and Mrs. William Cunningham of South Roston; three nephews and one niece. Funeral services were held in Danville.

Ruling Nears As Pool Hearing Is Concluded At Greensboro

GREENSBORO — Laying the ground work for their challenge of a city swimming pool threatened with integration, Negro attorneys completed a lengthy series of depositions last Friday. The attorneys have until August 4 to show that there was collusion between city officials and the group which bought the Lindley Park Pool. Questioning of city officials centered on the cost of building the pool, its operating costs, a zoning ordinance prohibiting profit-making business in the pool area and the steps taken before the city disposed of the pool at an auction. Councilman Elbert F. Lewis dismissed any conflict with the zoning ordinance by saying that the Greensboro Pool Corp., although organized as a profit-making enterprise, could not possibly make a profit on the pool. The Negro attorneys said, however, that the sale was in violation of the law. The corporation bought the pool for \$85,000 at an auction this spring. Mrs. Constance Baker Motley, an NAACP staff attorney from New York, led the questioning of Lewis, Councilman Tom Brown, Mayor George Roach and City Manager James R. Townsend. City Attorney Jack Eiland III objected to questions throughout the hearing, saying they were irrelevant and that the councilmen were not required to give their reasons for actions leading to the disposal of the pool. "We expect to present the findings to the judge before August 4," he said. "It is possible in the form of another complaint," the attorneys said. Such a complaint would likely require another hearing.
