CHICAGO — (ANP) — Mayor Richard J. Daley, official host to Prime Minister Kwame Nkrumah of Ghana when he visits the city July 30-31 with a retinue of 14 persons, announced the program of reception and welcome Thursday and named the committee which will be engineering the occasion.

Powell Has 'Amendments' To Science Education Bill

WASHINGTON — (ANP) — Congressman Adam Clayton Powell (D., N. Y.) last week told the Committee on Education and Labor that he had amendments ready to offer to the Hill-Elliott Science Education bill.

The statement was made after Representative Landrum of Georgia questioned representatives of Health, Education and Welfare as to whether the Commission of Education, under this bill, could stop payment of funds to states which are in defiance of the Supreme Court's decision.

Powell pointed out that the correspondence that he has had thru the years with the Secretaries of Health, Education and Welfare, with the Commissioners of Education and with the U. S. Comptroller, indicates that funds can be stopped, only upon the basis of a directive from Congress.

The Prime Minister and his party will arrive Wednesday, July 30, at 11:45 a. m. at National Guard airport. On Thursday's schedule will be visits to the Johnson Publishing company, various manufacturing plants, a luncheon with the Confectioner's association, topped by a private dinner at the Winnetka Inn, home of Clarence Randall, one of the city's great industrialists and steel magnates.

The Prime Minister will leave Friday at 10 a. m. by plane for London.

LONG, COOL CHOCOLATE DRINK

It takes just a little planning ahead to make summer entertaining as relaxed and pleasant for the hostess as it is for her guests. Filled to the brim with cold sweet milk and stirred, a nourishing and cooling drink is ready in no time at all.

For four to six servings, pour half a cup of instant chocolate mix into a pitcher and add a quart milk. For a single serving pour a half inch of the mix into a tall glass, then fill the glass with milk.

Good as it is, there is no need to stop with just plain chocolate milk. A great many flavor variations can be made.

For instance: Add a dash of ground cloves and cinnamon, or a few drops of maple flavoring to the basic mixture.

Replace some of the milk with a scoop of vanilla or coffee ice cream. For extra deliciousness, top it with a spoonful of whipped cream.

**Berlin Film Fete Names Sid Poitier**

HOLLYWOOD — (ANP) — The world's No. 1 actor for the year is a Negro. His name is Sidney Poitier.

The authority for this pronouncement were judges of the international Berlin Film festival, who selected the tall, lithe New Yorker (and ex-Miamian and Nassauan) for the honor because of his portrayal of the Southern fugitive Cullen in Stanley Kramer's newest film production, "The Defiant Ones."

The film was one of only three American motion pictures accepted as entries in the festival. "Best Actress" nod went to Anna Magnani for her role in "Wild Is The Wind."

Poitier is widely accepted as a great talent by his contemporaries, and on the strength of the rare critical acclaim received from the festival judges, he is looked up on as being well on the way to fulfilling his greatest ambition—that of top rating as an untype star of stars.

The "Defiant Ones," co-starring Tony Curtis, will be world-premiered in Chicago in mid-August.
