

St. Emma Military School Wins Highest Army Award For Fourth Consecutive Yr.

ROCK CASTLE, Va. — It has been announced by Lieutenant General George W. Head, Jr., Commanding the Second United States Army that the St. Emma Military Academy Corps of Cadets has been designated a National School for the school year 1957-58.

This award, inaugurated by the United States Army during the school year 1933-34, has been won by the Virginia institution each year since the award has been available for competition. Only 5 of the 43 schools in the 2nd Army area (Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, District

of Columbia and Virginia) have this distinction.

This outstanding military Belmont Plantation in the academy, located on historic beautiful James River Valley, Powhatan County, Virginia, has consistently ranked among the leaders of the nation in this of Accounts and the Annual 1958 Formal Inspection by the United States Army, the Battalion was cited for excellence in Parade and Drill Formations, Rifle Marksmanship, Weapons Training and Small Unit Tactics. Previously during the school year it had achieved a

Superior Rating at the Annual Ordnance Inspection, the Annual United States Army Audit of Accounts and the Annual United States Army Inventory of Equipment.

The Rifle Team was among the nation's leaders having finished 10th among the 282 schools of the nation in the recent National Defense Cadet Corps Rifle Matches. 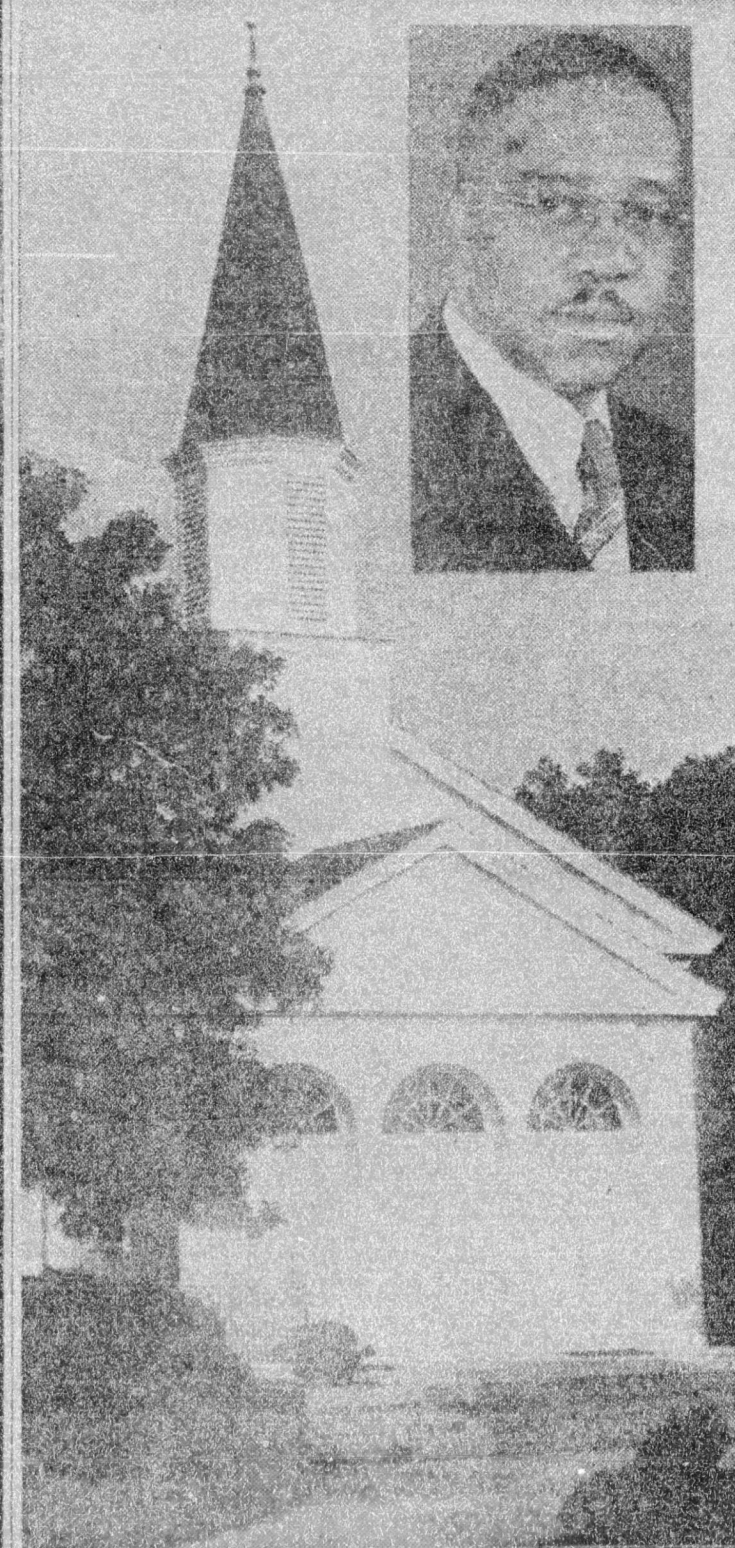
