#### National Meeting:

### Funeral Directors Set 21st Session For NY Aug. 3-7

NEW YORK — The 21st annual convention of the National Funeral Directors Association will be held in the 43-story New Yorker Hotel, 34th Street and Eighth Avenue in the Midtown area, from August 3 to 7.

The Ladies Auxiliary under the leadership of Mrs. Plugenia G. Peters, the Programming Mrs. Martha W. Wright and Planning Committee with Miss Catherine Payne and others have completed plans for the convention.

Registration will begin on Sunday, August 3 at 11 a. m. and close at 5 p. m. at the Concord Baptist Church. Other activities for the day

include the Governor's breakfast, executive committee meeting, board of directors meetings, and memorial services.

THE MONDAY SESSION will open with a business meeting at 9:30 a. m. An educational conference will be held at noon when the discussion clinic will consider the topic "Public Relations." Following the recess, exhibits will be reviewed from 2 to 5 p. m.

The educational conference on Tuesday will feature two addresses: "The Future of Funeral Service" by Dean S. H. Pierce, Sr., and "Management, the Key to a Successful Business" by Donald L. Rogers, New York Herald Tribune.

Following the recess, exhibits will be viewed from 2 to 5 p. m. The Annual Award Banquet is scheduled for Tuesday at 7 p. m. A. Johnson of Ebony will be main speaker.

In addition to the general session and exhibits, the Wednesday session will feature an address on "Pathology" by Dr. H. F. Smith, New York Medical Center, Professor Charles J. Latimore will deliver a second address on "Systematic Planning."

Thursday following the general closing session, the following two addresses will be delivered:

"Current Trend of Mortuary Education" by Professor Otto S. Margolis; and "Funeral Service Merchandising" by Rev. Russell A. Roberts.

The convention will be brought to a close Thursday night with the President's Ball and Floor Show.

#### Gospel Choirs, Choruses Plan Big Meeting

CLEVELAND, Ohio—All "stops" have been pulled out here in making plans for the 26th Annual Session of the National Convention of Gospel Choirs and Choruses, Inc., meeting in Cory Methodist Church, 1117 East 105th Street, August 4-8.

Some 8,500 delegates are expected to attend from across the country. Delegates will represent churches of all faiths, community choirs and choruses, and singing groups of all types. Dr. Thomas A. Dorsey of Chicago, Illinois, is National President and Mrs. Dorothy H. Boswell, President of the Cleveland Choral Union, is General Chairman of the 26th Annual Session.

On Sunday, August 3rd, early arrivals to the Convention will worship at Olivet Institutional Baptist Church, 3802 Quincy Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio—Dr. O. M. Hoover, pastor. On the same day an Appreciation Program will be held honoring the National President. Also a Founder's and Supervisors' Program will be presented by the Youth and Young Adult Department of the NCCCC.

The traditional Monday Morning Consecration Service will be held at convention headquarters to open the week-long series of meetings. Dr. O. M. Hoover will deliver the consecration sermon and his choir will sing.

On Monday evening, a 500-voice choir will appear in a pre-convention concert. Throughout the week workshops, study classes and forums will be held with emphasis on church music.

Dr. Dorsey will deliver the President's Annual Address on Tuesday evening which is also the presentation of the Scholarship Contest. This night is one of the highlights of the convention. This year's scholarship contestants will compete on the subject, "The Negro's Contribution to American History." The winner will receive a \$150.00 scholarship. Mrs. Mabel Hamilton of Chicago, Illinois, is Scholarship Chairman.

Other speakers for the week will include Rev. R. W. Wright, Detroit, Michigan; Miss Mary Wilke, National Youth President, Detroit, Michigan; Prof. Theodore R. Frey, Chicago, Illinois; and Rev. Joseph Jackson, St. Paul, Minnesota.

## Man Who Killed Sepian Released From Mental Hospital; Feeble And Harmless Now, Attorney And Medics Declare In Courtroom

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — A 76-year old white man who was committed to the state hospital in 1950 after shooting a negro was discharged from the hospital following a hearing Wednesday.

A. E. (Toke) Henderson was tried June 26, 1950 in Jefferson county on a charge of shooting Silas Fletcher. He

was found not guilty by reason of insanity to a first-degree murder charge in connection with the shooting.

The court ordered him committed to the state hospital the next day.

In filing the petition to secure Henderson's release, his attorney, Jack Holt, said Henderson had

suffered a stroke and was "feeble and handicapped." Dr. W. Payton Kolb, a physician at the hospital also stated that he did not believe Henderson was "dangerous."

Holt wouldn't comment on whether the murder charge could be revived against Henderson.

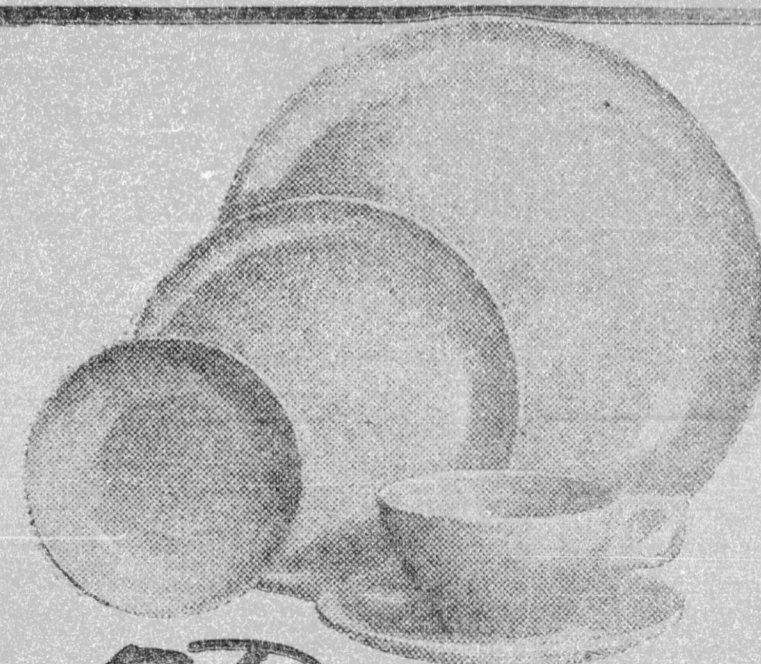

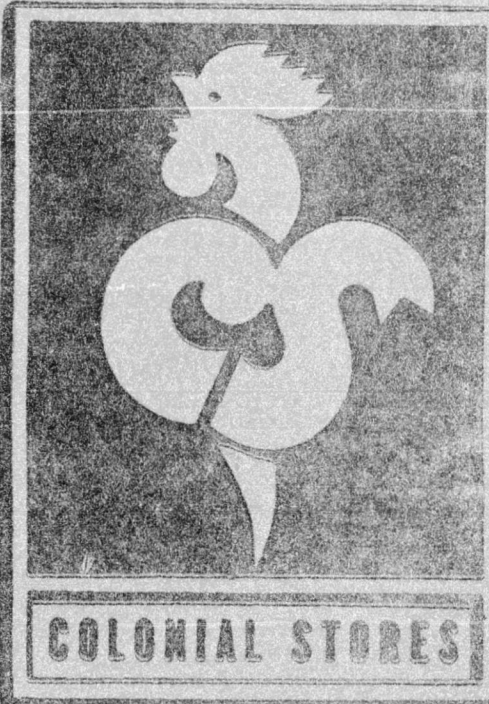
