

300 Spectators Attend Wake-Johnston Calf Show

Twenty-Four High Quality Dairy Animals Exhibited

Four-H and NFA boys and girls from Wake and Johnston Counties exhibited 24 high quality dairy animals at the Sixth Annual Bi-County Dairy Calf Show on the athletic field of Saint Augustine's College, Raleigh, Thursday, July 24.

Grand champion dairy animal was exhibited by Donald Hodge of Route 2, Wendell, and reserve champion was shown by George Latham, Jr. of Zebulon. They were presented with properly engraved gold loving cups. Best fitted animal was also shown by Donald Hodge. Showmanship was won by Mary Maye of Route 1, Morrisville. She, too, was presented an engraved plaque.

Twenty-four fine dairy animals parade the show ring escorted by 4-H Club and NFA members while officials of the sponsoring organization looked on with no regrets. The show is sponsored annually by the Raleigh Merchants Bureau of which G. Wesley Williams is Executive Secretary. It is directed by the Negro Agricultural Workers of the Wake and Johnston Counties.

The show got underway at 9:30 a.m. with a short demonstration "Good Points Of A Dairy Animal" by J. D. George, Extension Dairy Specialist, who also served as official judge. Greetings were brought by Dr. James A. Boyer, president of the college. Serving also as judge was H. Bruce Butler, Assistant Wake County Agent.

Williams, of the Merchants Bureau, had high praise for the 4-H and NFA boys and girls as he commented on noticeable progress over the 1957 show. Ben Hair, Wake County Commissioner; G. W. Miller, Wake County Agent; J. A. Spaulding, District Farm Agent; and J. W. Warren, District Supervisor of Vocational Agriculture, praised the boys and girls for a job considered well done.

The Danish System of judging was used. The 13 blue ribbon animals received \$10 each, 9 red ribbon animals received \$8 each, and 2 white ribbon animals received \$6 each. The prizes were presented to the exhibitors by T. J. Culler, Vo-Ag teacher of the Dubois High School, Wake Forest, L. R. Johnson, County Agent for Johnston County.

White ribbon winners were Willie Merritt, Route 1, Youngsville; and Joseph Spence, Route 1, Holly Springs.

The annual Bi-County activity is directed by the Negro Agricultural Workers of Wake and Johnston Counties.

Miss Towles Famed Model, To Headline

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Internationally famous model Dorothea Towles will be the featured artist at a fashion show and luncheon presented by Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority when the group holds its 50th anniversary boule in the Nation's Capital next month.

The fashion show-luncheon is scheduled for Tuesday, August 19th at the Sheraton Park Hotel, convention headquarters for the Sorority. Some 1,400 of the 2,000 delegates to the boule are expected to view Miss Towles' wardrobe, which is said to be valued at more than \$40,000. In addition to Miss Towles, some one dozen models, several of whom are nationally famous, will perform for the sorors.

A native of Texas where she attended Wiley College, Miss Towles' rise to fame in the highly-competitive field of modeling has been meteoric. Moving to Los Angeles following graduation from Wiley, Miss Towles was appointed to the faculty of Jefferson High School as a biology teacher and dramatic coach. Simultaneously she enrolled at the University of Southern California to study for the Master of Arts degree in dramatics.

It was during a 1949 tour of Europe that the famed Christian Dior "discovered" Miss Towles, and in a matter of weeks she was the "star" of Dior's Paris Salon.

2 South Carolina Klansmen Freed

GAFFNEY, S. C. — (AP) — Two Ku Klux Klansmen were acquitted last week at charges of assault with intent to kill in the November 19 bombing of a white couple here.

An all-white all-male jury rejected the state's admittedly circumstantial evidence and freed John Painter, 30, and James R. McCullough, 25. The two men were

accused in the bombing of the home of Dr. and Mrs. James H. Sanders. Mrs. Sanders contributed an article to a book on race relations in which she advocated gradual school integration. He is a surgeon and practitioner who lived in the area many years.

The bombing injured no one but the Sanders' home was damaged.
