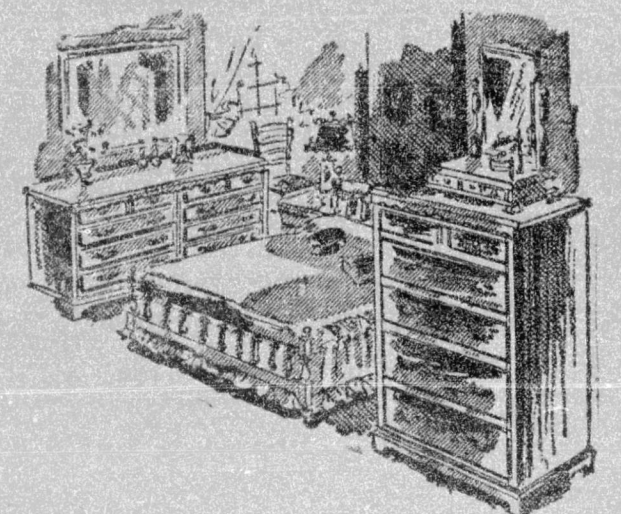
Mrs. Ella Edwards Williams of Raleigh, assistant librarian. Mrs.
