**LESSON X - AUGUST 31**  
The subject of the lesson is "Temperance and Social Justice" based upon the scriptural reading Proverbs 23:29-35; Daniel 1:1-16; Habakkuk 2:9-16; Romans 13:11-14.

**MEMORY VERSE:** "So then each one of us shall give account of himself to God. Let us not therefore judge one another anymore, but judge ye this rather: that no man put a stumbling block in his brother's way, or an occasion of falling." Romans 14:12-13.

TIME—The Book of Proverbs may have been written 1000 B.C. Daniel was carried to Babylon 606 B.C. The Book of Habakkuk was written 620 B.C. The Epistle to the Romans was written possibly A.D. 55.

But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the king's dainties, nor with the wine which he drank: therefore he requested of the prince of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.

**DISCUSSION**  
Much of the lesson text is full of warnings, and we know that there is a definite admonition, one thing for men to do, and that is to take this matter of drinking in hand before it becomes one's master, and not even go where these things will be put in the way to tempt us.

Daniel, along with a number of Hebrew boys, was taken as a captive to Babylon during the first invasion. How old he was we are not told, but he could not have been over sixteen years of age, because he was among those chosen to be trained in the royal court and, of course, only boys in their teens were ever so highly favored.

Babylon was about 700 miles from Jerusalem. Soon after these Hebrew captives were brought to Babylon, the king commanded the master of his eunuchs that he should select certain of them, well favored and skillful in wisdom, and train them, so that they

Addressing a concert audience, Robeson also said:

"When I read in America about the Sputnik my thoughts went out to my friends, the peoples of the Soviet Union whose minds and hands have created this miracle, opening up to mankind the boundless expanse of the cosmos.

Robeson is idolized in the Soviet Union for his voice as well as his left-wing views. He was introduced to a packed house of 12,000 cheering fans at Moscow's sports palace as the Union's "great and dear friend" and as a "fighter for peace and friendship throughout the world."
