

White Girl Says Little Rock Students More Interested In 'Dick Tracy' Than 'Mixing'

TOLEDO, O. — (AP) — A 15-year-old white Little Rock girl, now attending private school in Toledo, said last week that she would not object to attending an integrated school in her home town.

Ellis Bullion was a junior in Hall High School in Little Rock and enrolled in Maumee Valley Country Day School here when Arkansas Gov. Orval Faubus closed the high schools in that state's capital.

Ellis said there was little talk about integration last year at Hall High School, adding:

"Actually, all I know about it is what I read in the newspapers. And to tell you the truth, we kids were more interested in how Dick Tracy would get out of his mess than in the outcome of the school fight."

She said she was neutral on the subject of integration.

"If that is what the Government wants and they feel it is the Christian thing to do, it is all right with me."

Asked how her friends felt about the issue she replied:

"They don't look upon it as the burning issue of the day."

Florida Educator Challenges Virginia State College Body

PETERSBURG, Va. — A Florida educator told a Virginia State College audience last week that "young people today must measure up to a competitive society."

He was Dr. George W. Gore, Jr., president of Florida A&M University, Tallahassee, Florida.

The occasion was the formal vocation marking the 78th opening of the academic year at Virginia State College.

Dr. Gore indicated that seen our thinking must change to keep up with the evolving competitive society. "Today," he told the more than 1400 persons assembled, "we must think in world terms."

"Since the federal government is placing so much emphasis upon science, young people must prepare themselves to take their places in a scientific world."

"But," he added, "students must concern themselves with the humanities and languages for we must learn how to get along with and understand the people of the world."

The noted educator also advised the students to "cultivate your moral and religious life, for without this the other won't be worth anything."

"Young people today must be concerned with the importance of being excellent he emphasized. "Strive always to better your best," he concluded.

The speaker was introduced by President Robert P. Daniel of Virginia State College. Musical selections were rendered by Miss Afrika F. Hayes, soprano; Donald E. Barrett, piano; and William L. Griggsby, baritone, all members of the music faculty at the College.

Miss Devaki In Lecture At Shaw U.

In the first of a series of lectures by special speakers, Shaw University students and faculty heard Miss Mandyan Ananthampilla Devaki of New Delhi, India Friday, September 26 in Greenleaf Auditorium. Miss Devaki sketched the current problems in India, and discussed the political implications of planned economic development.

The Asian countries, she stated are attempting to grow rich in a world where there already exist countries which went through the same process nearly a hundred years ago, and today's developing economies have to grow against the competition, challenge and already advanced nations. The mass of a nation, knowing the standards of another, she stated, will not for long be denied the same opportunities.

Miss Devaki referred to the precarious balance of power between the U. S. and the U. S. S. R. who "two" India with economic aid and inducements as would a persuasive seller. This country, she said, takes gifts from both parties, often tinged with disgust and helplessness. Nations like Pakistan, Burma, Indonesia are trapped in an international holocaust.

She gave a brief description of the Indian method of planning, and explained how, through the Community Development Organization at the centre in Delhi, intention to raise the standards of living among the peasantry, has unintentionally prepared the peasantry for communistic indoctrination.

Through Mahatma Gandhi's saintliness and eminence, and the loud-voicedness of India's leader, Miss Devaki said that India entered into the limelight on the world stage too soon after independence and now the world sits watching and expecting great things of this country.

She declared that when a nation like the United States, which is supposed to represent an ideology that is the cause of democracy takes a step as it did in the mid-decade incident recently its implications on the committedness of the neutral nations of Asia would censure such an unilateral action. When we do so, she said, "who are our best fellows?" — the Soviet Bloc.

The large mass of Asians declaim the West, the West loses prestige in our eyes, and quite naturally, the communist bloc's prestige and appeal rises. "Without any desire to align we are unwittingly allied with them. She referred to the action of the West as "hasty, unthinking involvement in these price situations, playing the struggling new democracies into the hands of the Soviet Union."

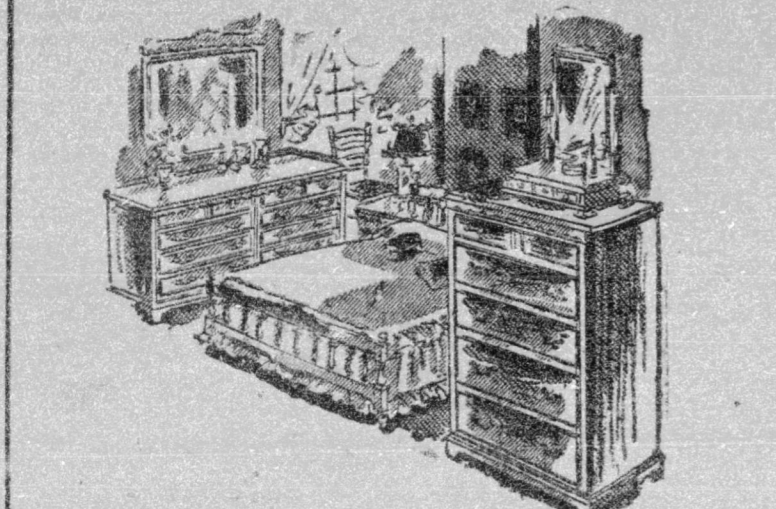
