Groups From Nine Counties To Exhibit At State Fair

9 COUNTY GROUPS TO EX-HIK
Representing the 75,487 Negroes of North Carolina who are active in club work activities of the Home Demonstration and 4-H clubs, nine county groups will have special exhibits at the North Carolina State Fair here October 14-18, according to R. E. Jones, Greensboro, state agent.

Three county councils of the Negro Home Demonstration clubs will prepare displays in the following divisions: Granville County, House Furnishings; Northampton County, Foods and Nutrition;

and Wake County, Clothing. \$250 is provided by State Fair for each club to produce its exhibits.

Six county 4-H club units will prepare exhibits, with the following selected to compete for the six awards that vary from \$300 for first place award to \$175 for sixth place: Anson, Gates, Harnett, Halifax, Lenoir and Person.

Club activities in 1957-58 had 22,140 members of the home demonstration groups, while 758 4-H clubs had a total membership of 20,197 girls and 22,150 boys. The work is directed from headquarters at A. and T. College, Greensboro, with personnel active in 52 counties of the state.

CAREERS IN RADIOLOGICAL PHYSICS

The advent of the atomic age has opened the door of science on a whole new area—and has created

a number of "new" sciences within the field of nuclear energy. Prominent among modern nuclear scientists is the radiological physicist, an essential figure in nuclear industry, whose responsibility it is to protect the worker in nuclear plants.

Radiological physics, or health physics, is the profession concerned with the study, evaluation, and control of radiation hazards. It has common interests with a number of well-recognized fields of specialization: physics, electronics, biochemistry, chemistry, biochem-

by biology, physiology, genetics, toxicology, and ecology.

TRAINING: Because of rapidly increasing manpower needs of the government and industry, the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission undertook in 1949 support of a fellowship program designed to train college graduates for positions in the field of radiological physics. These courses may be taken at specified universities or at the graduate level.

FELLOWSHIPS: Universities and corresponding laboratories where fellowships are held are: Vanderbilt University, Oak Ridge National Laboratory, University of Rochester, Brookhaven National Laboratory.

University of Kansas, Hartford Atomic Products Operation.

The basic stipend is \$2800. An additional \$350 is allowed for housing and \$300 for each dependent child. The stipend and emergency allowance will be paid in 12 equal monthly payments. The fellow award includes the payment of normal tuition, required fees, and a travel allowance of six cents a mile for the fellow (not dependent) from his place of residence to the assigned university.

In Killing:

Jury Rules White Cop Justified

ATLANTA — (AP) — A white policeman was justified in killing a Negro in a riot, a jury ruled last week.

The Fulton county grand jury refused to indict the policeman, W. D. Dempsey, and further agreed that Dempsey acted in defense of himself and fellow officers when he shot Joe Franklin Jeter, Jr., Sept. 18.

Negro leaders and the NAACP accused Dempsey and other police at the scene of what was a near riot of brutality. They said there was no excuse for the shooting.

The trouble started when police arrested a Negro "suspected" of "attempting" to hold up a drug store. A crowd of 200 to 300 Negroes assembled in the area and the riot began.

Officers said Jeter was shot after he knocked a policeman to the ground.
