NEW YORK CITY (ANP) - Do who rightfully should be consider you know how the National Asso- ed the descendants of the abolitciation for the Advancement of Colored People got started?

Do you know why the organization was established?

The NAACP was organized beause of a horrible lynching in 1908 in Springfield, Ill., the home of Abraham Lincoln who was the 16th President of the United States. Sponsors of the meeting to plan an organization to do something about lynching and other injustices against the Negro were aroused over the lynching in Lincoln's home state, though he was born in Kentucky.

Persons at this meeting included Oswald Garrison Villard, Rabbi Stephen S. Wisc, the Rev. Francis J. Grimko, Washington, D. C; Miss Mary White, Ovington, Dr. W. E. B. DuBois and others. As a result of this meeting, the NAACP was organized in 1909. The Crisis magazine was started in 1910, and it became the first Negro monthly publication to become self supporting under the editorship of Dr. W. E DuBois.


