

N. C. Negro College Conference Names Dean Payne As President

GREENSBORO — Dean Foster Payne of Shaw University, Raleigh, was elected president of the North Carolina Negro College Conference at the end of the 33rd annual session held at Bennett College last week.

He succeeds Dr. L. S. Cozart, president of Barber-Scott College, Concord.

Other new officers for the conference which holds its 1958 session at Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte are: Dean M. F. Smith, Livingston College, Salisbury, vice president; Dr. A. F. Jackson, A&T College, Greensboro, secretary; Dr. Sara B. Corbery, Barber-Scott College, assistant secretary; and Dr. W. E. Bluford, Johnson C. Smith University, treasurer.

Dr. William H. Brown, dean of the North Carolina College Graduate School, Durham, delivered the keynote address at the morning session on the year's theme, "Improving the Quality of Instruction."

Speaking on the theme from the viewpoint of a teacher at the afternoon session was Dr. John M. Bevan, professor of psychology at Davidson College.

In a spirited debate session after the resolutions committee's report, the conference adopted a resolution "that the North Carolina Negro College Conference go on record as commending State Attorney General Malcolm B. Sewell for his advocacy of law and order in support of the United States Supreme Court decisions on the school integration issue."

Several speakers opposed the resolution during debate, but a majority voted in favor of it.

Forty-four representatives from 12 of the State's predominantly Negro colleges attended the meeting.
