Association Of Colleges, Secondary Schools To Meet In Ky. Dec. 3-5

LOUISVILLE — Dr. William G. Pullard, executive director, Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, Oak Ridge, Tenn., will deliver the keynote address Wednesday night, Dec. 3, at Central High School, opening the 25th annual convention of the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

According to Dr. John E. Codwell, principal, Jack Yates Senior High School, Houston, Texas, and association president, the theme of the three-day meeting will be "Education in A Scientific Age—Problems and Opportunities." Educators from across the nation will attend the convention.

At the banquet session

Thursday evening, Dec. 4, Dr. Allison Davis, professor of Education and member of the committee on Human Development, University of Chicago, is scheduled to address the convention. Dr. E. B. Atwood, president, Kentucky State College at Frankfort, will install officers.

The convention program includes William W. Beckett, City Alderman, and Dr. Omar Carmichael, Louisville superintendent of schools, as program participants on Wednesday night.

Morning sessions of the convention will be restricted to meetings and reports of the Commission on

Colleges and Universities and the Commission on Secondary Schools. Dr. J. A. Colston, president, Knoxville College, and Dr. Clinton E. Young are Commission Chairmen.

Reports from Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools will be made Friday

morning, Dec. 5, by Dr. Raymond Wilson, Southern Association's executive secretary, reporting for the Commission on Secondary Schools, and Dr. Gordon W. Sweet, Commission on Colleges and Universities.

Other association officers are Dr. James A. Colston, president, Knoxville College, first vice president, W. E. Combs, state supervisor of Secondary Schools, Tallahassee,

Fla., second vice president, and Dr. L. S. Cozart, president, Barber-Scotia College, Concord, N. C., secretary-treasurer.

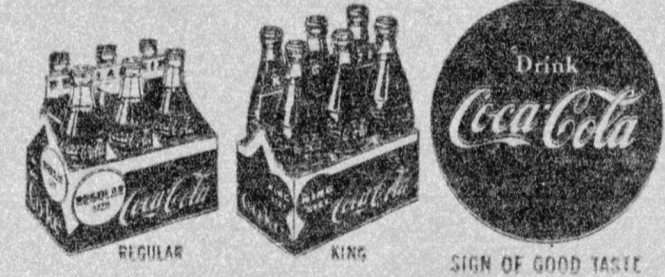
A great portion of his followers still believe in Prophet Jones as they swarm nightly in great droves to his meetings.

Gov. Almond Opposes Reprisals Against Negro School Students

RICHMOND, Va. — (ANP) — Gov. J. Lindsay Almond publicly told reporters that he was opposed to any retaliatory policy of closing Negro schools in areas where white schools had been locked pursuant to the state's anti-integration laws.

"Many outside Virginia," he commented, "would feel that closing Negro schools would be a vicious and retaliatory blow against the Negro race. I would not want to be charged with harboring such a spirit."

It was conceded by the governor that he might have to seek "new plateaus" from which to evade federal court orders to integrate state schools. He objected to a legislative commission as such an appointment "would manifest a lack of confidence in the laws we now have."

In the meantime the State Supreme Court of Appeals is scheduled to rule on the constitutionality of the massive resistance laws of the Dominion state.

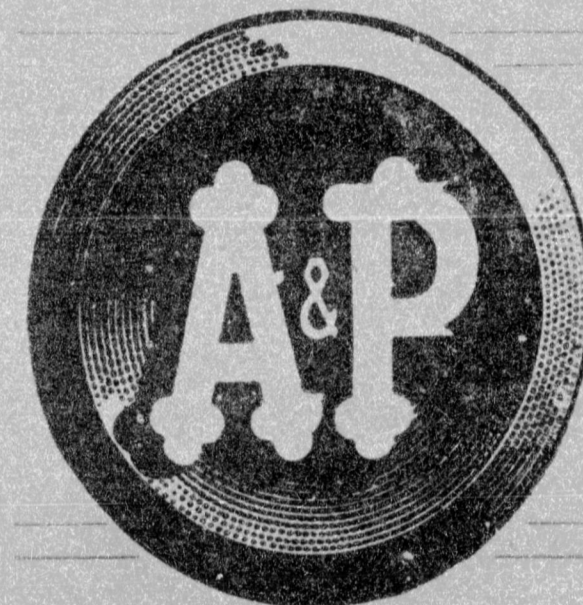
