

AGO A couple of years ago, a dense fog at Ibadan prevented me from making a plane connection from there to Kaduna. The plane circled the field but did not land, so I had to take the Kaduna Express, By plane, the trip would have taken 3 1-2 hours; the train, with its innumberable stops and heavy load, took exactly 24 hours.

In the first class train travel, one occupies "compartments" I shared one with two British officers in Nigerian service, and a young Lebanese trader who was born in and therefore is a citizen of Nigeria. There was a tollet in the car, which made me wonder what facilities there were in the third class coaches. In addition, there was a dining room at one end of the car from which excellent meals were served. The door to the car, however, was locked so passen-

gers from other classes could not enter. The Emir of Horin, and interestngly-turbanned, 80-year old chieftan - who has the power of life and death over his subjects, so I inderstood - was in one of the compartments.
