**T. F. Koop, Newsmen,
Speaks At Shaw Fri.**

Theodore F. Koop, director of CBS News and Public Affairs in Washington, D. C., will speak at Shaw University on Friday, December 12, at 10:00 a. m. in Greenleaf Auditorium.

Mr. Koop is a native of Monticello, Iowa. He was graduated from the University of Iowa with the B. A. degree and Phi Beta Kappa honors. He is a former newspaper man and an author.

From 1928 to 1941 Mr. Koop was with The Associated Press, being stationed in the Des Moines and New Haven bureaus, then in New York as city editor and on the general news desk, and later as one of the three news editors in the Washington bureau.

Koop has covered many top news stories, including the third inauguration of President Roosevelt, and he directed the AP coverage of Wendell Wilkie's presidential campaign in 1940. He is the author of "Wesop of Silence," a book on censorship published in November, 1946. He contributed a chapter on radio news to "Dateline, Washington," published in 1949.

Mr. Koop was the first radio newsman to be elected to the Board of Governors of the National Press Club and the first to serve as president. In 1953, he is also chairman of the board of the Radio Television News Director Association.

**3 Major Threats To
Traffic Safety Told**

Three major threats to traffic safety at this time of the year were described by State Motor Vehicles Commissioner Ed Scheidt. "One threat is reduced visibility," he declared. "It's obvious that our daylight hours this month are the shortest of all the year. Add to this the ever-present possibility of some vehicles' lighting systems, and bad weather, the poor condition of the dark clothing worn by many pedestrians, and you can see that

a driver really can't afford to relax vigilance for an instant." The vehicles executive said another threat is posed by inadequate traction. "The fellow on foot is far more likely to slip and fall these days than in the summer, and the fellow behind the wheel must stay constantly alert against skidding hazards," Scheidt observed.

The third threat is that presented by quick changes of temperatures, he added. "icy highways are about twice as slippery when the thermometer indicates near-melting readings, compared to near-freezing temperatures. The defensive driver takes these conditions into account and reduces his speed, lengthens distance between moving cars, starts signaling turns sooner, and makes his stops more gradual."

"And when conditions warrant, needed to provide more reliable traction, he takes time to put on tire chains stop-and-go traction."
