

Zoo Keeper **Credited For** Reindeer

WASHINGTON, D. C. - Great credit for the success of the longest single haul of an Arctic reindeer perd-Alaska's Christmas gift to her sister states and President Eisenbower -- goes to Charles W. Thomas, Negro senior keeper of large animals at the National Zoological Park in the Nation's Capi-

The herd arrived here this morning and will participate in the Nation's Christmas observances on December 23 at the Pageant of Peace in the President's Park located south of the White House. Amid ceremonies attended by officials of the Zoo, Government

and the trucking industry, the 14 Arctic reindeer were unloaded at the Zoo after a 5100-mile journey by air, sea and land in the face of predictions by veteran animal handlers that 50 percent would die

All previous attempts had falled o move reindeer without fatality for so great a distance.

Credit for the fact that the Zoo's first herd of Arctic reindeer did arrive safely has been ascribed to what National Zoological Park Director, Dr. Theodore R. Reed, calls the excellent teamwork of transportation officials, of Mr. Thomas and J. Lear Grimmer, associate director of the National Zoological Park with whom Mr.

Grimmer and Mr. Thomas rrived in Kotzebue, Alaska in nid-November and spent three lays of corralling and tying the vild herd, only three of which had seen handled before by humans. Great care had to be exercised n caring for the animals. They

vere given medicines, including tranquilizers. Accustomed to Arctic eating habits, they had to be converted to new methods, a feat necessitated considerable coaxing and babying from Mr. Though accustomed to Arctic temperatures, they had to be protected from wind drafts because of their susceptibility to shipping fever.

The reindeer were flown the 650 niles from Kotzebue to Anchorage, Alaska in an Alaska Air Command plane. They were taken by Alaska Railroad to Seward and placed on the Iliamna, an Alaska liner, for the 1400 miles to Seattle, Wash-


