Methodist Church To Raise \$ Million For 13 Colleges

NASHVILLE — (ANP) — The Methodist Church has set a goal of one million dollars for 13 Negro colleges in a churchwide offering on Feb. 8. Congregations will be asked to observe that date as Race Relations Sunday and earmark special offerings for the schools, it has been announced by Bishop Paul N. Garber, Richmond, Va. He is chairman of the Commission on Christian Higher Education, which is directing a nation-wide campaign to expand and strengthen colleges and universities of the denomination.

One of the institutions that receive aid from the Race Relations Sunday offerings will be Philander Smith College, Little Rock, Ark. Dr. M. L. Harris has been president of the Little Rock school since 1936 and Bishop Matthew W. Clark, Jr. of St. Louis is the chairman of the Philander Smith College board of trustees. Rumor U. S. To Close Virginia Naval Air Base On July 31st

RICHMOND, Va. — (ANP) — State officials are worrying over the announcement of plans to close the Chincoteague Naval Air Station. The base would include 70 civilian jobs and a big color payroll.

Some observers think this is just a part of the price the federal government is going to make Virginia pay for its rebellion against the U. S. Supreme Court. One news account of the announcement that the station will close July 1, 1959 is headed: "Fear and Worry Stalk Streets of Chincoteague."

Among the expressions of worry on the lips of the people are these sad comments:
"It's going to make a graveyard out of Chincoteague."
"It just doesn't seem possible."
"We're going to lose our homes and everything. There's no job around here."
"We don't know which way to turn."
And down at Norfolk, one of the centers of rebellion against the desegregation deci-

ion of the Supreme Court the Navy plans to pull out some of its ships and send them to Charleston, S. C. This move will a large number of Navy personnel from the Norfolk area, and will greatly damage the city's economic status because that community depends almost entirely on government military installations and civi-
