Albert Hudson, 33, of 805 S. Person Street, was allegedly stabbed to death at his place of business, The Birdland Club, S. Bloodworth Street. Walter Terrell, 27, of E. Cabarrus Street, is believed to have wielded the fatal knife wound. Hudson was the father of seven children, none of whom are over 15 years of age.


