'Numbers Baron' Gets 6-Mos. Term

DETROIT (AP) — Thueson McKinney, 44, former boxer, and

bouncer at the Flamingo Show Bar, was sentenced Monday to six months in the Detroit House of Correction. He was also fined \$2,000 and \$250 costs, to be paid

within six months.

McKinney was convicted as a member of a 11-2 million dollar a year number syndicate. He was arrested last Oct. 3 with 17 other persons.

Six other members of the interracial numbers syndicate received six months jail sentences; six others were placed on probation and five were fined a total of \$20,750.

Police said during the raid on five homes, they confiscated \$200 in cash, eight automobiles and 11,000 bet slips.
