### Don Newcombe Has Troubles Off-Season

NEWARK, N. J. (ANP) — Don Newcombe who, in the past few seasons, has developed into a sort of hard-luck player, is having troubles off the baseball diamond as well.

Last week the fast-balling right-hander went into court to answer charges of assault and battery against Ulysses Ross, 36, of East Orange, N. J. The charges grew out of a fight at a local tavern owned by Newk.

On trial also in connection with the incident were his two brothers, Norman and Harold. Don and Norman were charged with assault, while Harold was accused of threatening Ross with a pistol.

Only those feature-length motion pictures shown commercially in Los Angeles for a 7-day period are eligible for Academy Awards, although separate recognition is afforded the best foreign language film of the year and films competing in that category need not meet this requirement.

Most eligible English language films made abroad last year were produced in England—34, France made 35, Italy 19, Germany 6, and Japan 5. The remaining 15 came from Spain, Greece, Sweden, Canada, Africa, Austria, and Mexico.

Production in the United States accounted for 212 motion pictures. By title, pictures were shown under names beginning with every letter of the alphabet except "X".

The "Oscars" will be announced April 6 at Hollywood's RKO Pantages Theatre and the presentations broadcast and televised over the National Broadcasting Company network.

Most two-thirds of the 396 pictures released last year, which meet the requirements for Academy Awards consideration, were in black and white, and approximately one-third were produced outside the United States.

## St. Paul's Test Center For Students

LAWRENCEVILLE — President Earl H. McClenney announced today that Saint Paul's College will be one of the thirty colleges participating in the testing of 5,000 to 6,000 scholarship and admission candidates from more than 700 high schools distributed throughout the United States and the Virgin Islands.

Saint Paul's College will cooperate in administering the Cooperative Intercollegiate Examination between February 23, and March 7, 1959, which will be given in some 265 test centers across the nation during this period. The Cooperative Intercollegiate Examination Program is an educational service of the United Negro College Fund. The examination is open to qualified high school seniors and to a limited number of high school sophomores and juniors of exceptional ability and promise.

Application forms for the examination may be obtained from the high schools listed above, by writing to one of the participating colleges, or by writing directly to Office of the Director, CIEP, 22 East 54th Street, New York 22, New York.

Admission to the examination is by ticket only. Admission tickets will be sent to each candidate who has filed application paid an examination fee of \$2.50.
