Men like James Weldon Johnson, Walter White and others—including Joel E. Spingarn, its first president—have passed on to their well-earned reward after lives of service to freedom and equality of human beings of all races.

Today, NAACP stands on the threshold of a golden era of successful negotiating and litigation which have moved the Negro much farther up the ladder of freedom from educational, economic, cultural and political oppression than at the beginning.

Within the past few months, weeks, we've seen the white flag of surrender to law and order go up in the Old Dominion on three battlefields of school desegregation. Even Gov. Lindsay Almond, Jr. has capitulated without having the stamens of the South's great hero—Gen. Robert E. Lee—who was man enough to admit his defeat.
