Brenda Kee, Ligon Hi Honor Student, Presented In Recital

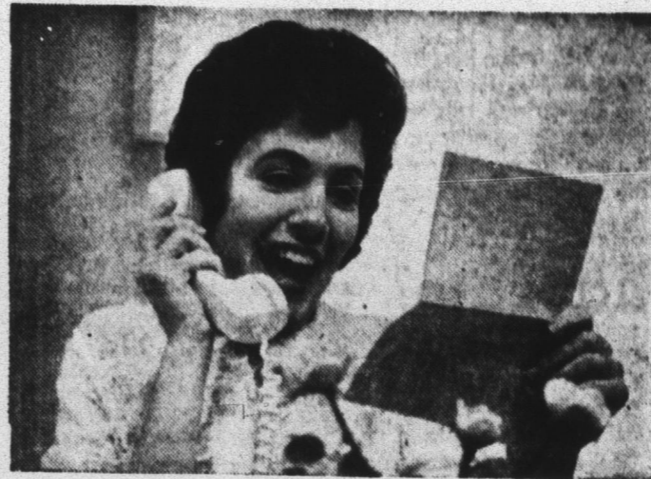

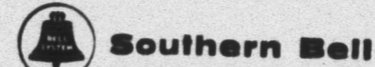

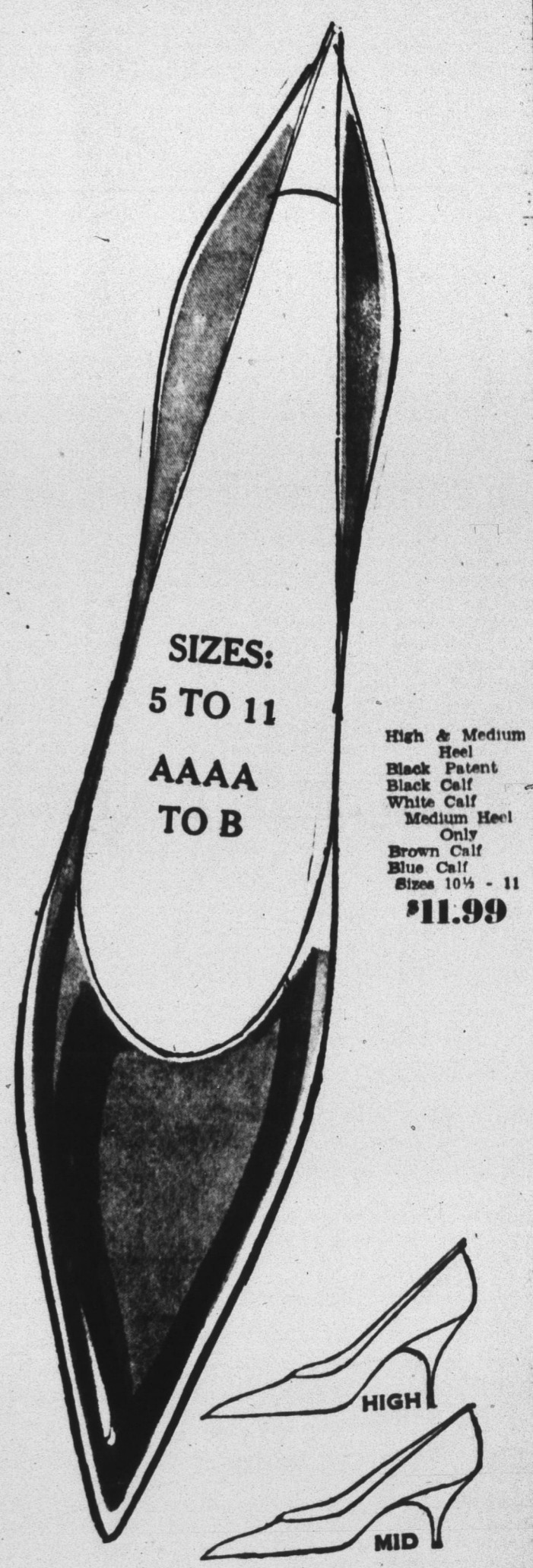


Rev. B. Cox Freed

BATON ROUGE, La. — Rev. B. Elton Cox, CORE field secretary was released last week from the East Baton Rouge Parish Prison upon the order of the Louisiana Supreme Court. Bond of \$7,125 was posted by CORE. Cox has been convicted on three misdemeanor counts growing out of CORE demonstrations in Baton Rouge this past December. He has been sentenced to 21 months in jail and has been fined \$5,700. Rev. Cox pastors the First Congregational Christian Church, High Point.

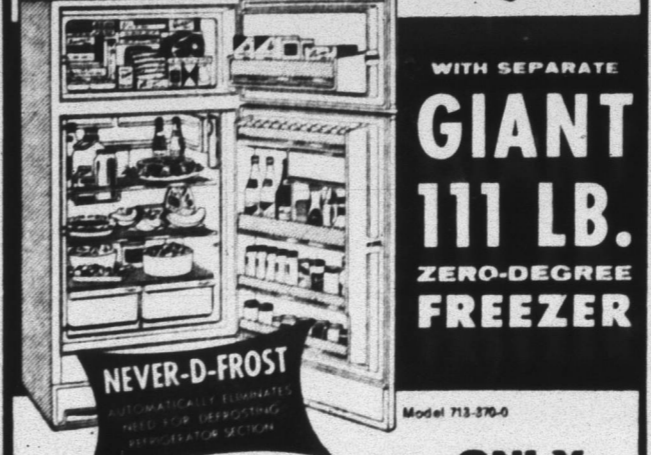
