

AME ZION WOMEN HOLD RETREAT

BLACK MOUNTAIN — Camp Dorothy Walls, the quiet retreat and camping site of Western North Carolina Conference of the AME Zion connection was host two days last week to a score of more executive officers and supervisors of the General Conference auxiliary — The Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society (WHFMS) with Dr. Abbie Clement Jackson, president, in charge.

Six carloads of the leading missionary workers of the Zion conference spent a night in reviewing the spacious camping facilities which have been greatly improved since the 68-acre two-story dormitory was purchased in 1958 by the WNC Conference and named in honor of Bishop W. J. Walls' wife — Dorothy.

The WHFMS leaders obtained the services of Dr. Frank R. Brown, Dean of Religion, Hood Seminary, Livingstone College, Salisbury, N. C. in arranging the retreat and conducting the communion service which concluded the two days of meditation. This was the first time all officers of WHFMS had visited the camp which has added a modern boys' dorm this summer along with a new large cottage.

Mrs. Dorothy Walls was as active as the summer staff and the wives of presiding elders and ministers and laymen in preparing the delightful meals served the guests. Among the others were Mrs. Lotie Clark, Mrs. C. E. Norman, Mrs. F. B. Blake, Mrs. Barbara Jones Taylor, dietitian; Rev. W. L. McDaniel, manager and several junior workers.

Following the retreat, the WHFMS officers returned by motorcade to Salisbury for their executive meeting, a prelude to the forthcoming August conference.

"A CREATIVE PAUSE"
Stressing the need for meditation and communion with God, Dr. Brown cited scriptures which told of Jesus going off alone and into the garden to pray for more strength. He said: "Retreat is withdrawing from our usual occupation, from the bustle and bustle of daily life, to a quiet lonely place for God — centered prayer and meditation in conscious awareness of the presence of God for the purpose of spiritual growth and strength in the

knowledge and love of God." Brown added: "With the Holy Spirit as our guide and comforter, one goes into retreat because of a deep desire and longing to know God better; follow Him more closely; and love Him more dearly."

Dr. Brown concluded thusly: "Spiritual fatigue, spiritual hunger, and spiritual longings demand regular periods of spiritual withdrawal from the world and its problems in order that, waiting quietly in the presence of God, with thoughts and affection centered on Him, we may be recharged, revitalized, renewed in spirit."

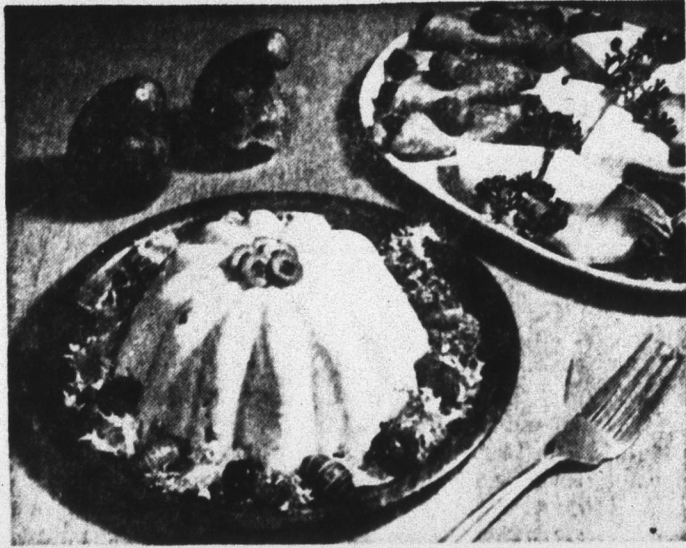
CARNATION COOKING HINTS

MOLDED DEVILED EGG SALAD
(Makes 4 to 6 servings)

| 1/2 cup mayonnaise | 1/2 cup sliced stuffed green olives |
| 1 tablespoon (1 envelope) unflavored gelatine | 1 tablespoon prepared mustard |
| 3/4 cup cold water | 1 teaspoon seasoned salt |
| 5 chopped hard-cooked eggs | 1 cup undiluted CARNATION EVAPORATED MILK |
| 1/2 cup chopped celery | 2 tablespoons lemon juice |

Place mayonnaise in mixing bowl. Soften gelatine in cold water. Dissolve over hot water. Add gelatine to mayonnaise. Mix well. Add remaining ingredients. Mix well. Pour into a 1-quart mold. Chill until firm, about 2 hours. Unmold by dipping in warm water for a few seconds. Turn out on salad greens. Garnish as desired.

Links Launches Yule Card Drive To Aid VL

NEW YORK—The Links, Inc., a nationwide women's organization devoted to advancing civic and cultural activities, has launched its 1962 Christmas card campaign, with proceeds going this year to the National Urban League toward support of its program. Links officials announced.

Preparations for immediate action in the drive were shaped at a joint meeting of Links and NUL officials. Attending were Dr. Anna Julian of Chicago, chairman of the Links National Projects Committee; Whitney M. Young, Jr., NUL executive director; Mrs. Isabel Chisholm Clark, assistant director for administration, and Mrs. Evelyn Brody, staff associate. Not present, but also a committee member was Mrs. Pauline Weeden of Roanoke, Va., immediate past president of The Links. Mrs. Vivian Beamon of Cincinnati is current president of the organization.

She is also vice president of the UL of Cincinnati.

The Links, founded in 1948 and represented by 80 chapters in 86 cities, chose the League as recipient of this year's project proceeds at its recent National Convention. In the last two previous years, proceeds of the campaign went to the NAACP.

The 1962 greeting cards will be of artistic design and universal appeal, the committee said. They will carry a holiday greeting. Accompanying the cards will be an enclosure describing the Urban League and its program.

Designs for the cards are now in preparation and the campaign is expected to be in full swing by early October, with each Links chapter participating in the nationwide promotion.

Mrs. Clark will serve as coordinator of the Christmas card project, working in liaison with Links chapters throughout the country.

Expectant Mother Beaten By Husband

Samuel Turner, 30 years old was handed a long prison term here Friday for assaulting his pregnant wife with intent to kill.

Turner was sentenced from seven to ten years.

Mrs. Carolyn Hill Turner, 20 testified that the assault took place during a ride from Raleigh to Wilmington that her husband forced her to take with him on July 19.

She further testified that her husband beat her with an iron pick on the way from Raleigh to Benson and later took her to the home of his sister, Mrs. Eva Mae Smith, for medical treatment.

Mrs. Turner was later admitted to Sampson County Memorial Hospital for treatment.

The ride took place after an argument the couple had at their Raleigh home.

Turner, formerly of Clinton, was arrested by Wake deputies and turned over to Sampson Sheriff

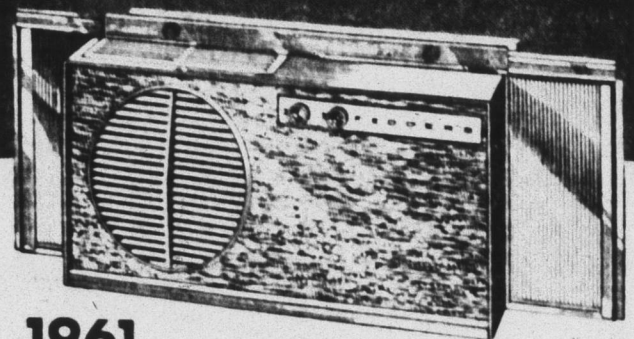
