Amer. Legion Sponsors "Know Your Government" At Shaw Univ.

Excellence is the key to better
things of life. Dr. Nelson H. Harris,
Interim President, Shaw University,
told the American Legion Boys
and Girls State Representatives
Monday night, June 17, as he spoke
to them in Greenleaf Auditorium.
He urged the group to be deeply
concerned with quality, outstand-
ing performance, for "complacency
at half speed will surely result in
mediocrity at a time when the
world is asking for excellence," he
declared. Excellence does not come
automatically, but comes only as
the result of hard work.

Thirty-two girls and thirty boys
are attending sessions on Shaw
University's campus to learn the
mechanics of government first-
hand, from city, county, state and
federal government officials. The
program is under the auspices of
Division Six of the American Leg-
ion, and began Sunday, June 16, to
close June 22. Officers in charge
of the sessions are E. B. McKisick
of Asheville, director of Boys' State;
Mrs. L. B. Vase, of Kinston, di-
rector of Girls State; Mrs. Dor-
othy Hager of Belmont, assistant di-
rector; Mrs. Violet M. Pullen, pre-
sident, Ladies Auxiliary; Charles
Irving, past vice-commander; Dr.
Benjamin F. Smith, vice-com-
mander Division Six and H. A. Ful-
ley of Rocky Mount, counselor.

The Monday morning session
featured speakers Attorney F. B.
McKisick of Durham and J. Ever-
ette Miller, assistant superintend-
ent of Public Instruction.

J. Everette Miller spoke on the
roles of the city, county, state and
federal governments. Miller's sta-
tistical information showed that
there are four and one half
million people in North Carolina,
which is a half million more in the
last ten years; and one out of every
four persons living in North Car-
olina goes to school.

Tuesday morning, June 18, Mrs.
Sam Webber, Director Division A
of the American Legion spoke on
the history of the Poppy. Other
speakers for Tuesday's session were
James R. Durham, senior agent, S.
E. I. whose subject was "Law En-
forcement-City, County and State
Governments"; I. L. Clayton, as-
sistant commissioner of Revenue,
who spoke on "Sources of Govern-
mental Revenues - City, County,

State and Federal Governments;"
and Dillard S. Gardner, Marshall
and Librarian Supreme Court of
N. C. on "The Judicial Branches of
City, County, State and Federal
Governments."

David Taylor, Administrative As-
sistant on Functions of City Govern-
ment and David W. Watson, sen-
ior Resident Agent FBI on Law
Enforcement, Federal Agencies.

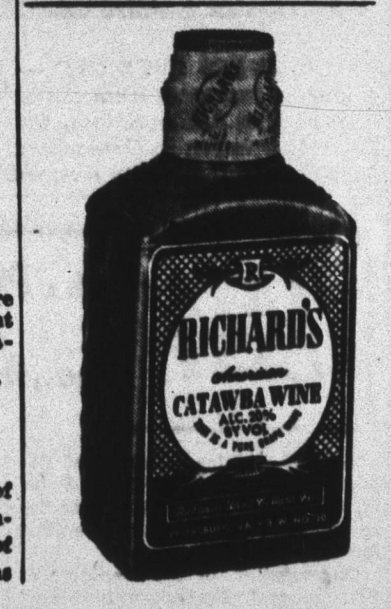
