Local White Officer Is Caught In Racial Web

Bobby Coats, local white police officer, who has gained quite a reputation as a catcher of speedsters, is not enjoying much of a reputation on the race question, as the result of an interview which he is alleged to have had with a representative of Newsweek Magazine.

The police officer is said to have told the interviewer, according to the national magazine and a prepared statement which he gave his superiors and seen by the CAROLINIAN representative that he felt the Caucasian race was superior biologically and mentally to the Negro.

This statement is said to have raised the ire of many local citizens and has brought him numerous responses from all over the nation. Coats said that letters are flowing in from every part of the nation, from both whites and Negroes. Some of them agreed with him and some did not.

Chief of Police, Tom Davis, told the CAROLINIAN that Coats was certainly not expressing the opinion of the Police Department and he considered it an unfortunate incident, by one of his officers. Chief Davis was asked many of the questions that are running the gamut in and around Raleigh. Such as, Why was Coats picked by the interviewer? Why was not a police maker of the Department selected? By what authority did Coats feel that he was competent to pass on such a question?

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NCNW Sets Washington Conference

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Negro women will take a look at themselves in this generation during the 28th annual convention of the National Council of Negro Women, Inc., November 13-17 in Washington, D. C.

The Convention will have headquarters at the Statler Hilton Hotel in this city. A two-day Leadership Seminar will precede plenary sessions and provide the forum of inquiry into the convention theme: "The Negro Woman in the Emancipation Century".

The call to convention was issued this week by the group's national president, Miss Dorothy I. Height, of New York City. The National Council of Negro Women, Inc., has a membership of 25 National Organizations in 47 states representing nearly three-million women. Direct membership is in 87 local councils and junior councils in 87 states. A leadership core of direct membership is comprised of 857 Life Members.

The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. is a non-profit national body founded by the late Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune in 1935 and incorporated one year later. Its basic purpose is to unite the

WASHINGTON (AP) — Leading liberal supporters of the Kennedy civil rights bill denounced the Administration last week for weakening the House-approved bill, but the voices of the five Negro Congressmen were conspicuously absent.

While the Attorney General was pleading for House Judiciary Committee members to cut back on the strong bill recommended by the Judiciary subcommittee, ANP learned that at least three of the Negro Congressmen were not even in Washington.

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Says White Agents 'Not Available'

The latest information received by The CAROLINIAN as it went to press Wednesday afternoon was that the arrest total in a gigantic crackdown on alleged bootleggers in the city and county, may well exceed 100 persons before the end of the probe this week.

Ironically, all of the 93 persons already arrested and the 208 warrants drawn so far apply solely to Negro bootleggers in the area. Maurice Peacock, general manager of the Wake ABC Board said that a white undercover agent had been requested, but so far none are available.
