Ex-Ambassador Speaks At NCC

DURHAM — Dr. John H. Morrow, former ambassador to the Republic of Guinea, now director of training program, recently urged North Carolina College students to attempt to make a contribution to Western willingness to understand and assist the underprivileged of the world.

Morrow, who headed the NCC Department of Romance Languages from 1956 leaving to accept the diplomatic post, addressed the college's Forum assembly on the subject, "The Time is Now."

Speaking of career opportunities in various federal agencies and the State Department, he congratulated students upon their being in college preparing themselves to make contributions to the American scene and to the world.

"Your parents have realized — and don't you ever forget this — that for each generation there are more and more doors open," he said.

"The wiser among us have made the important discovery," he continued, "that college is not a dull waiting room, where students passively mark time until the moment arrives to file out into a few hand-picked professions."

Employees Hear About Burglars From 1 Who Is

If you want to know how to guard against burglars, ask one.

Humble News, employee publication of Humble Oil and Refining Company, did just that. The November issue of the magazine carries a story on how to protect your home against burglars. It was written by a convicted burglar who is now a prisoner at the State Prison of Southern Michigan.

An inmate at the prison asked Humble's editors if they would like an "insider's" article about burglary from his cellmate, a burglar with 15 years experience. The prisoner-writer assured the editors that the formative (how to avoid having inconveniences and frustrations to being a thief) and in-

formative (how to avoid having a house stolen right off its foundation). After checking with prison authorities and getting official approval, Humble News ordered the story. It is a good one.

"Homes," says the veteran burglar, "simply aren't designed with burglars in mind; very few residential buildings are, aside from penitentiaries."

In addition to the known precautions such as notify the milkman, mailman and paper boy when you leave your house unoccupied, he gives some other good tips:

- Make sure you have a good set of locks with dead bolt mechanisms that can't be opened with a strip of celluloid.
- If you must hide a spare key outside the house, hide it at least 10 feet from the door.
- When you go out, at least one light burning in the house will discourage burglars, and the best place for it is in the bathroom.
- If you are going to be gone for more than three days, notify the police and let them know the approximate date of your return.
- Keep a record of serial numbers of all guns, cameras, typewriters, and appliances — to expedite insurance claims in case your house is burgled.
- Dogs are excellent burglar insurance, but if you take yours when you leave home, make certain his empty kennel isn't too conspicuous. Added to other small signs, this can tell an experienced burglar all he needs to know.

What about the burglar-author? He is now serving 2 to 2 1/2 years on an "attempted breaking and entering auto" charge. He expects to rejoin the outside world in early spring or late summer next year.

What about his future? He says: "I don't plan to return to my illegal profession."

Mom Of 9 Gets Term For 2 Daughters

DETROIT (AP) — A mother of nine last week was jailed for 10 days by Traffic and Ordinance Judge Andrew C. Wood for permitting two daughters to violate the curfew law.

Mrs. Sarah Reed, was charged with allowing one daughter, 16, and another, 15, to be out at 1:35 a. m. on Sept. 29.

The law says that children under 17 must be off public streets from midnight until 6 a. m. on week nights and from 1 a. m. until 6 a. m. Fridays and Saturdays.

Policewoman Renie Harbis told Judge Wood that the woman's division has had 57 contacts with Mrs. Reed and her family, including a previous suspended sentence on a curfew violation against the mother.

Mrs. Reed's children ranging in age from six weeks to 21 years, are being cared for by relatives, policewomen said. Mrs. Reed's husband died in 1953.
