

# 600 Students To Attend State Drama Clinic At FSC

## Many Teachers Will Bring Hi Schoolers

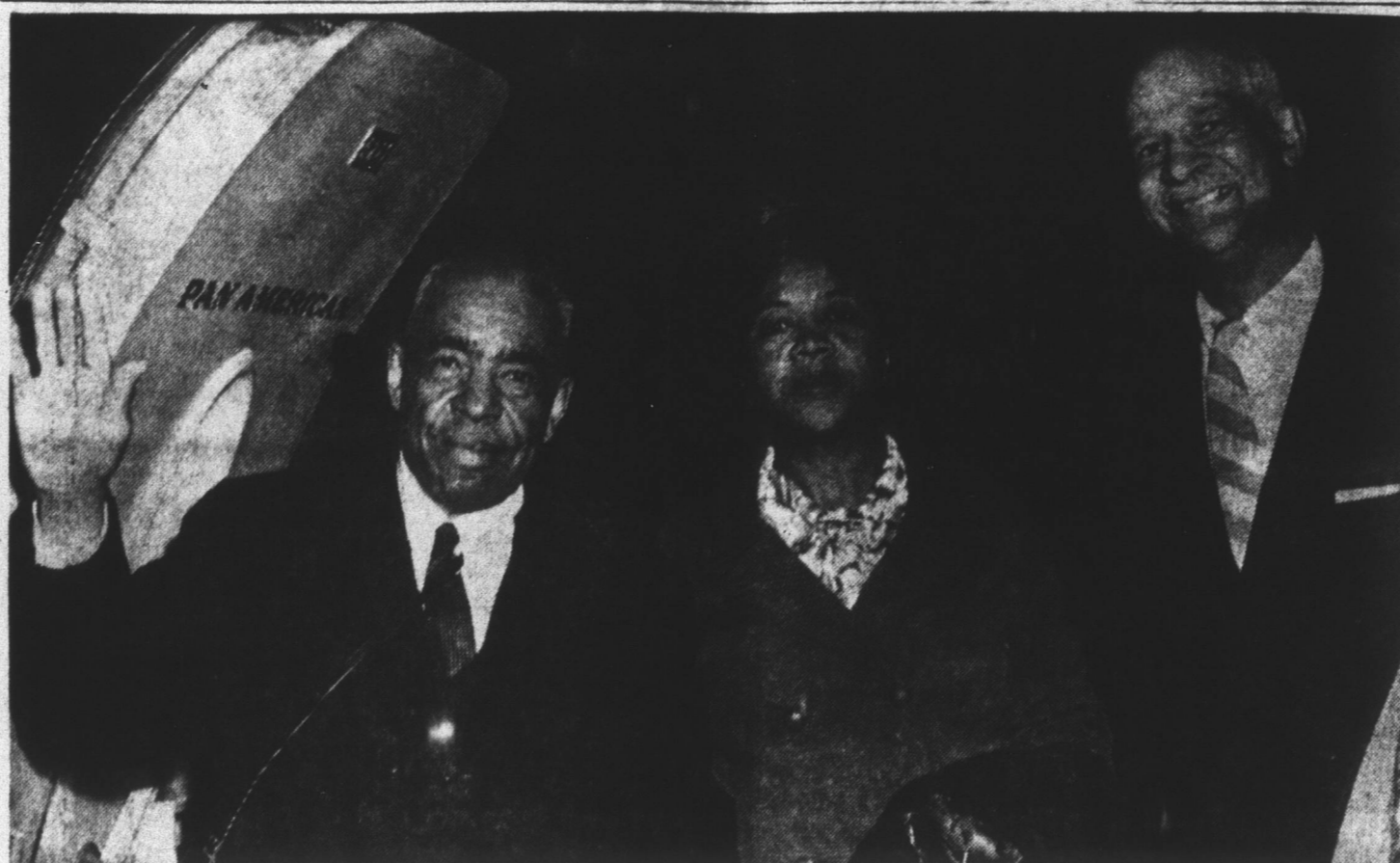
FAYETTEVILLE — The 1964 Annual Drama Clinic, which is usually held each school year in February, has been scheduled this year for Saturday, December 5, at Fayetteville State College. Fayetteville State College and the North Carolina High School Drama Association have announced that six-hundred students and teachers of Eastern Carolina are expected to attend the Drama Clinic is underwritten by the North Carolina Teachers Association.

The Drama Clinic will consist of three main sessions. The morning session will involve demonstrations and presentations of papers on dramatics. The afternoon session will be centered around two one-act plays for analysis by Mary Potter High School, Oxford; and Sampson County High School of Clinton. Another feature of the afternoon session will be scenes and reports by Eastern Carolina students who attended the Governor's School of Performing Arts.

The participants are Misses Linda Kerr, E. E. Smith High School, Fayetteville; Miss Olivia Hardy, Brawley High School, Scotland Neck; Miss Doris Smith, North Warren High School, Wise; and Walter Norfleet, Mary Potter High School, Oxford.

For the evening session the Drama Guild of Fayetteville State College, under the direction of Lois Turner and Winifred Johnson, will present Katharine Merrill's exciting three-act drama, "A Distant Bell," in the J. W. Seabrook Auditorium at 6:30 p. m.

The president of the North Carolina Drama Association is John Bias of Scotland Neck and the executive secretary is C. C. Lipscomb of Ligon High School in Raleigh.

## By Elder Ecker:

## Mount Pisgah Told To "Send Out Thy Light"

ROCKY MOUNT—The Mt. Pisgah United Presbyterian Church Men's Council had as guest speaker Sunday Elder Charles Stanley (Chuck) Ecker, Eastern Area Director, Commission of Evangelism, United Presbyterian Church USA, who spoke as a layman viewing the need for more concern about evangelistic work on the part of the laity in redeeming some three hundred ten thousand (310,000) members lost from Presbyterian rolls through suspension during the past ten years.

Eckers, who gave his automotive business to work for the Church as a salesman for evangelism to inspire churchmen to win others for Christ, noted that where ten members have been recruited six have strayed away from the church over a ten-year period.

After nearly four years at this work Ecker sees the need for more dedication on the part of laymen without leaving the major task to the minister and few kindly elderly women of the church to recruit members and try to interest those who join.

Born in Pittsburgh, Penna., and living at Williamsport, Penna., for a quarter-century before moving on to Ridgewood, N. J., Ecker has the oversight of 1850 churches from Maine to Florida, the leaders of which he seeks to arouse to dynamic Christian witnessing for Christ—each in his or her own personal way, both in and out of the church. The speaker warned against churches "fencing themselves in" rather than "fencing far out" to bring others into the fold. He also reminded that while we wish to have people become Christians in any denomination, certainly Presbyterians would be more zealous to build up their own churches. "You must let people know which branch of the church you belong to and be proud to extoll its greatness," he said.

"Check with those who have dropped out to find out why or in what way you have offended them—go the extra mile in an effort to reclaim delinquents and prove that the church is a mission of selflessness to saving souls."

Ecker noted that Catawba and Atlantic Synods would combine in efforts to increase membership some ten per cent by October 1965 to take up a loss of 5,000 members in Atlantic Synod alone over a 10-year period.

R. D. Armstrong is president of the local Presbyterian Men's unit, which gave a breakfast meeting and seminar with Ecker as guest prior to morning worship at 11 a.m. Rev. J. H. Costen is minister of Mt. Pisgah U. P. Church.

## "Develop Union Of Faculties," Dr. Blanchard Tells Listeners

GREENSBORO — "Develop the unique union of faculties that are yours and you need have no fear of conformity," Dr. Brand Blanchard, professor of philosophy at Yale University, told Bennett College students Thursday.

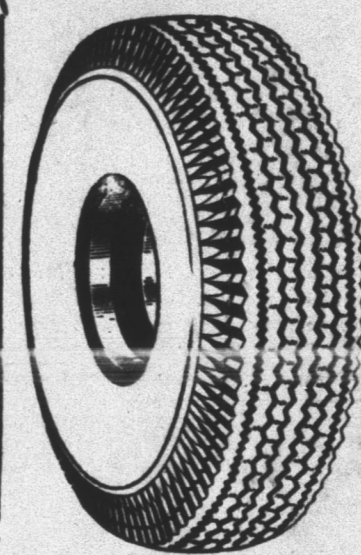
Appearing under the auspices of the visiting scholars program of the Piedmont University Center of Winston-Salem, Dr. Blanchard spoke on "The Problem of Conformity."

"The tragedy for most of us," he said, "is that pressures or apathy turn us into stereotypes. The highest freedom is conformity to self-imposed law."

Dr. Blanchard pointed to the vast size of the American market and the advertising pressures of the mass media of communication as the major factors making for conformity but said that these pressures "must be and can be escaped."

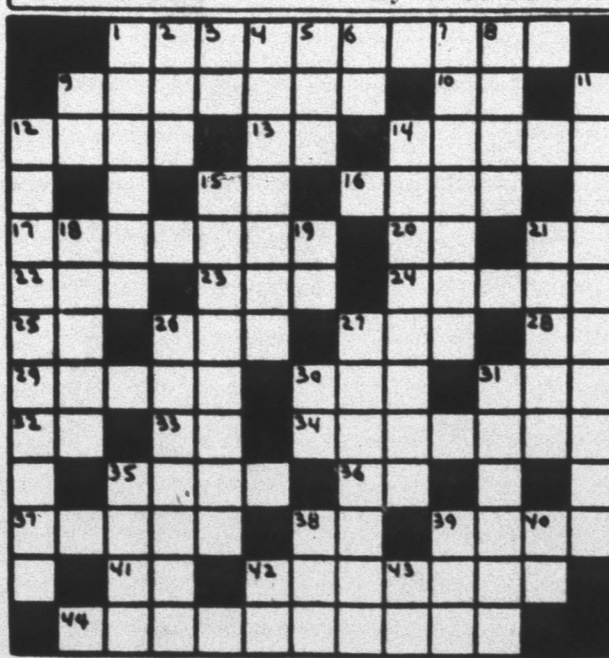
