You will please publish the obituary of our highly esteemed sister, WINNAFORD PITTMAN, wife of Joel Pittman, who departed this life Dec. 29, 1875 -from disease of the heart-aged 66 years, 5 months and 18 days. She was beloved by old and young: every child who knew her looked upon her as a mother. She united with the Primitive Baptist Church at Beulah Saturday before the third Lord's day in June, 1831, and was baptized by Elder Wm. Wall on the third Lord's day in June, 1831. As a member of her profession, her christian walk and conversation, enough cannot be said. She generally filled her seat in the Meeting House. Her seat was never vacant when she was able to get there. She would go through heat and cold to hear the word of God proclaimed.

She died on Wednesday night. Arrangements were made for her burial to be on Friday following—it being Lenerally understood that her funeral would be preached, there was a goodly number of her friends in attendance. Her body was placed in the coffin, and then her funeral was preached by Elder Wm. Brown, from Rev. 14: 13, "And I heard a voice from heaven'saying unto me write, blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: yea, saieth the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors and their works do follow them."
