I have heard several funerals preached, but have never heard one more affecting, nor a sermon more to the point, as a funeral ser-

mon, than was delivered on that occasion. The grave was ready prepared, and after the funeral service was over the corpse was conveyed to the grave, and the brethren united in filling it up.

Sister WINNAFORD PITTMAN was the mother of fourteen living children—ten daughters and four sons; and, her grand and great-grand children are numerous.

We all grieve to part with our friends and relatives; but, the friends and relatives of sister PITTMAN cannot grieve as those who have no hope, but they can rejoice in the blessing that she was prepared to meet her heavenly Father in peace.
