SUSANNA

SUSANNA is another of the "holy names" with which the Scriptures abcond. Though it has been contracted rather generally to Susan, the proper form, and the one which possesses an interesting history, is Susanna. It signifies "lily," and comes from the ancient Hebrew name Schuschannah, which, in sound, more nearly resembles the French Suzanne.

The story of Susanna, related in the additional chapters of the Book of Daniel, and repudiated by St. Jerome, has been commemorated in balled tapestry and painting. The name also belonged to one of the holy women of the sepulcher, and it was in martyrs who suffered death in the times of persecution.

The most famous Susanna of history was the "Lily of Tillis," the Queen Susanna who was put to death by the Mohammedans for her religious faith. All the picturesque romonce of the early ages centers in her history. The English call this name Su-

annah, and by a curious coincidence almost without equal in ctymology, the French, German, Swiss and Bavarlans agree ment Susanne as a favorite na-
