Republicans See Chance to Carry Lone Star State

Fort Worth, Tex., Sept. 24.—The state of Texas, ever a paragon of Democracy, now is experiencing the greatest political surprise of its life. For the first time in history the Republican party actually is seriously talking about carrying Texas in a national election, and just the thought of that possibility is giving old line Democrats a headache. A Republican victory would be a political eighth wonder of the world, say these Democrats and they refuse to believe it can happen, but there are some, even many, Democrats who say it can happen and they are striving to see that it does. Smith or Hoover—that is the line upon which the party is split in Texas. The Democratic party has a normal majority of 400,000. But the Republicans and anti-Smithites say they are going to carry the state. The old line Democrats say they will sweep the state as usual—so the final answer to the question will be settled on November 6th. Texas might furnish one of the surprises of the campaign.

Smith Will Speak in Raleigh?

Charlotte, Sept. 24.—If Governor Smith delivers an address in North Carolina as contemplated it will likely be at Raleigh. O. M. Mull, state chairman and former Governor Morrison, national committeeman, today telegraphed national headquarters to recommend that city be selected. Selection of Raleigh was occasioned because of auditorium facilities required can be provided there.
