STATE BANK EXAMINER SAYS DEPRESSION IS NOT GENERAL

Raleigh, N. C.—Failure of the Central Bank and Trust Company, Asheville, an \$2,100,000 institution, a few days ago and the widespread failures of several other smaller banks in Asheville, Biltmore, Hendersonville and other places is not a reflection of conditions in general in the State, but as an aftermath of boom conditions, inflation of real estate values and high financing carried on some three years ago by high-pressure operators under the Florida boom, is the belief of John Mitchell, chief State bank examiner. Mr. Mitchell warns against hysteria on the part of the people of the State, a condition which often results in a panic that few banks can withstand. Announcement of the Western Bank and Trust Company that a withdrawal of more dollars was available and that it would pay depositors who sought to withdraw, is believed to have helped allay the panic in Asheville and vicinity.

COVE CREEK BASKET BALL TEAM DEFEATS BOONVILLE
