Local Banks Comply

With Recent Legislation

In the interest of relieving the stockholders in the Watauga County Fank and the Bank of Blowing Rock of double liability on their stock holdings in those institutions, Mr. John G. Albn, from the examining staff of the State Banking Department, was in Boone on March 19th.

The Legislature recently passed the Lindsay Bill and it was immediately ratified. It makes the following provisions for relieving stockholders in State banks the following provisions for relieving stockholders in State banking institutions of double liability:

1. Publication by the banks in a mewspaper having general circulation in the community where bank is located, once each week for four consecutive weeks prior to May 1st, 1935, of the bank's intent to seek such relief.

2. Mailing written notice to each depositor and to each other creditor prior to May 1st, 1935.


